
President of EU Council hosts Armenian-Azerbaijani summit in Brussels



Belgium - EU Council President Charles Michel meets the leaders of Armenia and Azerbaijan in Brussels, July 15, 2023.

Armenian Prime Minister Nikol Pashinyan and Azerbaijani President Ilham Aliyev met in Brussels on July 15 for fresh talks hosted by the European Union's top official, Charles Michel.

Speaking after the trilateral meeting, Michel gave no indications that Aliyev and Pashinyan narrowed their differences on an Armenian-Azerbaijani peace treaty discussed by them. He said he urged them to "take further courageous steps to ensure decisive and irreversible progress on the normalization track."

"Even though our meeting took place in the context of a worrying increase in tensions on the ground, I noted an important momentum in the political discussions and efforts," Michel said in a statement to the press.

"The Armenian and Azerbaijani leaders once again fully reconfirmed the respect for the other country's territorial integrity and sovereignty based on the understanding that Armenia's territory covers 29,800 square kilometers and Azerbaijan's 86,600 square kilometers."

"Real progress depends on the next steps that will need to be taken in the near future," added the president of the European Council, the EU's top decision-making body.

An Armenian government statement on the talks said the three leaders agreed to "intensify the work towards the settlement of the discussed issues," which included not only the would-be treaty but also Azerbaijan's continuing blockade of the Lachin corridor, "the rights and security" of the Karabakh Armenians and planned transport links between Armenia and Azerbaijan.

Ambassador of Azerbaijan to EU receives a warning for threats against MEPs who visited Armenia



The offices of the President of the European Parliament, Roberta Metsola, and the High Representative for Foreign Affairs and Security Policy, Josep Borrell, condemned and described as unacceptable the behavior of the Ambassador of Azerbaijan to the EU, Vagif Sadikov, who threatened the members of the European Parliament, who had visited Armenia to familiarize with the situation on the border with Azerbaijan. Vagif Sadikov was summoned to the European Service of External Relations for the threatening post made on Twitter against the MEPs.

Let's remind that Sadikov made a post on "Twitter" regarding the visit of the

delegation of the European Parliament to Armenia, threatening the MEPs. He posted an image and description of an Azerbaijani-made sniper rifle with the following caption: "They know what to do protect themselves. The "Istiglal IST-14.5" sniper rifle produced in Azerbaijan has an effective fire range of about 3000 meters. Stay away from the state border of Azerbaijan..."

The topic was covered by the OC Media news platform, quoting the reactions of the EU spokesperson and the head of the delegation visiting Armenia, MEP Nathalie Loiseau, to Sadikov's post. The spokesperson of the European Union emphasized that they condemn such behavior, which is not appropriate for an ambassador accredited to the EU.

The threatening post of the Azerbaijani ambassador was also addressed by Euobserver, which spoke with Nathalie Loiseau.

Loiseau said that she has sent letters to the President of the European Parliament

and the High Representative of the Union for Foreign Affairs and Security Policy, Josep Borrell. The spokesperson of the President of the European Parliament replied that any threat to the members of the European Parliament is unacceptable. "We are examining this issue," Metsola's spokesperson said.

Josep Borel's office noted that the European External Action Service has summoned the Azerbaijani ambassador in connection with the post and told him clearly that they expect this to be the last time when Azerbaijani diplomacy will show such disrespect towards EU institutions and their representatives.

Nathalie Loiseau added that the threatening and insulting note of the Azerbaijani ambassador to the EU is not the only one addressed to the MEPS who visited Armenia, clarifying that other Azerbaijani officials also called them corrupt. Loiseau emphasized that the President of Azerbaijan also uses such rhetoric.

Under the false pretext of smuggling, Azerbaijan is trying to subordinate the office of ICRC in NK to Baku's ICRC office

Recently, the Azerbaijani state propaganda machine has been actively circulating the illegal demand to withdraw the ICRC office from Artsakh or to subordinate it to the ICRC office in Baku, constantly looking for an opportunity to justify and implement it, ARMENPRESS reports, the Office of the Human Rights Defender of the Republic of Artsakh issued a statement, emphasizing that "under the false pretext of smuggling, the July 11 step of Azerbaijan is part of the chain of actions aimed at the implementation of that vile policy."

"This morning, at the illegally installed checkpoint over the Hakari Bridge in the Lachin corridor, the Azerbaijani side again blocked the entry of the vehicles transporting patients and their accompanying people to Artsakh, as well as the already limited amount of medicines transported from Armenia to Artsakh by the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC).

This time Azerbaijan used the false pretext of "smuggling".

Cars belonging to the ICRC are hardly being searched in any part of the world as thoroughly as they are done at the illegally installed checkpoint of Azerbaijan, which aims to deliberately obstruct the mission of the only international humanitarian organization in Artsakh.

Azerbaijan clearly ignores the special status of the ICRC defined by international law, which envisages the inviolability of ICRC personnel, vehicles and cargo.

This is not the first case when Azerbaijan deliberately creates obstacles for the activities of the ICRC in Artsakh. Thus, earlier, the Azerbaijani side demanded to check the passports and vehicles of the ICRC drivers, as well as of the transported patients at the illegally installed site. Since June 15, due to the obstacles that

had arisen, the bilateral transportation of patients and their accompanying persons to Artsakh by the ICRC was completely suspended for 10 days in a row.

By undermining the activities of the ICRC, the Azerbaijani side once again proves that humanitarian issues and the humanitarian crisis in Artsakh are used as a leverage to put pressure on the peaceful population of Artsakh and create unbearable living conditions for them.

Recently, the Azerbaijani state propaganda machine has been actively promoting the illegal demand to either suspend the ICRC Office in Nagorno-Karabakh or subordinate it to the ICRC office in Baku, constantly looking for a reason to justify and implement its goal. And today's incident is part of the chain of actions aimed at implementing this vile policy of Azerbaijan", reads the statement.

Armenia Expects 60% Surge in Trade with Russia in 2023



Economy Minister Vahan Kerobyan predicted on July 12 a continued sharp increase in Armenia's trade with Russia resulting in large measure from the Western economic sanctions against Moscow.

Russian-Armenian trade doubled last year and in the first five months of this year. Kerobyan predicted that trade is very likely to surge by 60% in 2023 (as opposed to 2022)

"Last year, our trade turnover with Russia reached more than \$5 billion and we have been seeing its doubling," Kerobyan told the TASS news agency as he attended a trade exhibition in the Russian city of Yekaterinburg. "Armenia economy is growing at double-digit rate now and I think the trade with Russia will grow by 50-60% at the end of the year," Kerobyan concluded. The minister emphasized that Russia is the number one trade partner for Armenia.

Armenian government data shows that the trade with Russia totaled \$2.5 billion in January-May 2023, compared with about \$1.2 billion with the European Union.

The unprecedented upward trend is primarily driven by Armenian exports to Russia that tripled in 2022 and January-May 2023. Goods manufactured in third countries and re-exported by Armenian firms are thought to have accounted for most of that gain. They include consumer electronics as well as other hi-tech goods and components.

According to Armenia's National Statistical Committee, Armenia's foreign trade turnover in January-May 2023 soared by almost 87% year-on-year to over \$7.3 billion

The Armenian government has faced in recent months strong pressure from the United States and the EU to curb the re-export of these items. It announced in late May that Armenian exporters will now need government permission to deliver microchips, transformers, video cameras, antennas and other electronic equipment to Russia.

James O'Brien, the sanctions coordinator at the U.S. State Department, visited Yerevan late last month to discuss the issue with Prime Minister Nikol Pashinyan and other Armenian officials. According to the U.S. Embassy in Yerevan, he "expressed appreciation for Armenia's continued commitment to upholding U.S. sanctions."

Minister of Territorial Administration and Infrastructures Gnel Sanosyan, Minister of Education, Science, Culture and Sports Zhanna Andreasyan, Minister of Health Anahit Avanesyan, Minister of Environment Hakob Simidyan, President of the Football Federation of Armenia Armen Melikbekyan, and guests were present at the event.

Addressing the ceremony, PM Pashinyan said: "There are people who do not belong to themselves and their family only, but to a wider circle, to the country, to the people. Khoren Hovhannisyan is one of those names." Nikol Pashinyan quoted Khoren Hovhannisyan as saying he never had the opportunity to train in such conditions. "It is very important that this also brings a change in thinking, brings with it a new way of thinking. Fair play, fair competition is the most important thing in football today and it is becoming more and more important in sports," he said.

The construction of the sports school started in spring 2022. This is the first sports school in the history of independent Armenia built from scratch in the Kentron community of Yerevan.

The school is designed for 250-300 children, who will have the opportunity to train on a daily basis.

The sports school meets high international standards. It has a high-quality artificial turf pitch, the administrative building includes a heating and ventilation system, auditoriums, offices, dressing rooms and a gym.

Iran and Armenia have common interests and concerns - Ambassador

The "Questions to the Ambassador" initiative is being implemented on the platform of the "Orbeli" analytical center operating under the Public Relations and Information Center of the Armenian Prime Minister's Office, within the framework of which interviews are organized with heads of diplomatic missions accredited in Armenia, Armenian ambassadors abroad, representatives of international organizations, etc., on key issues of Armenian foreign policy agenda, bilateral and multilateral relations.

Within the framework of the initiative, the guest of the "Orbeli" analytical center is the Ambassador of Iran to Armenia, Abbas Badakhshan Zohouri, who is completing his mission in Armenia.

- Your Excellency, the year 2022 was quite an important and effective year in terms of the development of Armenia-Iran cooperation in almost all fields. In the political sphere, there have been enough important meetings, mutual visits, top level negotiations. The Consulate General of the Islamic Republic of Iran was opened in Kapan, the bilateral trade turnover records an unprecedented progress, exceeding 700 million USD. How would you assess bilateral cooperation in the past year, and what expectations and benchmarks are there for the coming years?

- We witnessed the growth and development of relations in various fields. Most importantly, on political and strategic issues, we witnessed the continuation of regular contacts at the highest levels and the strengthening of mutual trust and respect. One of the important events of last year was the opening of the Consulate General of the Islamic Republic of Iran in Kapan. Bilateral cooperation in the field of infrastructures, including energy and transport infrastructures, also recorded positive developments. Last year, the trade turnover between the two countries also increased by more than forty percent and

crossed the threshold of 700 million USD.



The increase in trade turnover continued in the first months of this year as well. We witnessed interesting trends also in terms of human contacts and public opinion towards each other.

- Mr. Ambassador, the whole world, including our region, is facing serious political and security threats. The Armenian and Iranian peoples, as the indigenous peoples of this region that have been neighbors and friends for several thousand years, and their states are trying to face new challenges, often showing quite close positions. In your opinion, how can bilateral cooperation in the direction of facing common challenges be made more effective?

- Maintaining and strengthening the atmosphere of trust and mutual respect between the authorities and peoples of the two countries was one of the important areas in the center of attention of the embassy in recent years. I think that at present, more than ever, we realize the importance of bilateral cooperation and there is a real will to expand cooperation in both countries. It is necessary to strive to maintain this dynamic. Another important point is to draw attention to the fact that deep and serious developments are taking place at the international and regional levels, which may lead to the creation of unexpected opportunities and challenges. Based on this, I consider the continuity of contacts and consensus between the authorities and expert circles of the two countries to be very important. In particular, expert and professional communication can help foster mutual understanding; correctly predict challenges, and proper planning of grasping opportunities.

- Mr. Zohouri, it has been more than 4 months since Azerbaijan closed the Lachin Corridor, as a result of which the 120,000 Armenian population of Artsakh has appeared under siege. Azerbaijan has also placed a checkpoint in the corridor. These actions of Baku are another gross violation of the tripartite declaration of November 9, 2020 and violate the right of Artsakh Armenians to live freely and safely in their homeland. What is Tehran's position on this issue, and how can Iran support the resolution of the crisis?


- Our advice to all parties to the November 9 declaration and the subsequent agreements has always been to adhere to the letter and spirit of these agreements and commitments. The countries also have clear obligations under international law, one of which is to protect the rights and safety of the residents of the region. We note that the issue of the rights and security of the residents of the mentioned area is a complex and delicate issue.

- Armenian and Iranian expert fields often talk about the need to develop security cooperation between the two countries. According to you, what are the prospects for bilateral cooperation in this field?

- The Islamic Republic of Iran and the Republic of Armenia have common interests and common concerns in the field of national security. You are aware that among the periodic contacts between the heads of the two countries, there were regular meetings and contacts between the secretaries of the national security councils of the two countries during the past year. Institutions responsible for national security in both countries also closely cooperate with each other. This is the path that should be continued

at different levels. Another





page 8 direction to pursue and pay attention to in the field of national security is the regular process of serious political consultations between the ministries of foreign affairs and strategic dialogue between the two countries. In this regard, in March of this year, we witnessed the visit of Iran's Deputy Minister of Foreign Affairs for Political Affairs, Mr. Bagheri, to Armenia.

- Mr. Zohouri, as we know, the North-South highway is being built in Armenia, thanks to which Armenia can become one of the key routes of the North-South international corridor. On October 20, 2022, Iranian Foreign Minister Amir Abdollahian announced during his visit to Armenia that an Armenia-Iran-India platform should be created for effective cooperation in the sidelines of North-South Corridor. By the way, it should be noted that tripartite political consultations were held at the Armenian MFA recently. At the same time, some expert circles are skeptical about the implementation of the North-South International Corridor project. How important is this corridor for Iran, what are the material obstacles on the way to its implementation, and what are the concrete expectations from Armenia to implement this important regional program as quickly as possible?

- Most of the trade between Iran and Armenia is carried out by the land route from Nurduz to Yerevan, which passes through the Syunik Province of Armenia. Within the framework of the "North-South" road project in Armenia, the Armenian government has serious plans to improve the infrastructure of this route and turn it into an international transit road. We also attach great importance to the full implementation of this project in the territory of the Republic of Armenia, and Iranian companies are ready to actively participate in the implementation of this project. The implementation of this project will contribute to the launch of the Persian Gulf-Black Sea transit corridor through the territory of Iran and Armenia, which has also attracted the attention of other countries. The North-South road project is a large-scale project, both economically and in terms of implementation. The implementation of a project of this scale is one of the largest economic projects in the history of Armenia. The works must be carried out very carefully in terms of financing, tendering, project implementation and monitoring of deadlines. I think that now the perspective of the implementation of the project has significantly improved.

And in the end, since your diplomatic activity in Armenia is coming

to an end, during it, what significant obstacles did you face for the development of bilateral relations, which could have been solved by the state structures of the Republic of Armenia, and which still continue to exist? And what are the most impressive achievements during your tenure in the Republic of Armenia?

- During the farewell meeting with Mr. Pashinyan, I highly appreciated the cooperation shown by him, the government of the Republic of Armenia and the state system in developing relations at different levels. I consider it necessary to thank once again for all the cooperation shown by the Armenian side during my mission. Without the will and cooperation of both parties, it would not be possible to advance the works. Of course, this does not mean that the situation could not be better or that there are no obstacles and problems. My understanding is that increasing awareness of each other's capabilities and potential, reducing bureaucratic barriers, and speeding up and facilitating cooperation and especially focusing on key issues is of primary importance and can contribute to further development of relations. The development of relations in all spheres is the joint achievement of the authorities and peoples of the two countries in recent years.

Blockade of Lachin corridor discussed at EU Foreign Affairs Council



In a letter to the Parliament, Dutch Foreign Minister Wopke Hoekstra has presented information about the meeting of the EU Foreign Affairs Council held on June 26, where the blockade of the Lachin Corridor and the deepening of humanitarian crisis in Artsakh were also discussed, the Federation of Armenian Organizations of the Netherlands informs.

According to the source, EU High Representative Josep Borrell informed the foreign ministers of the EU countries that Azerbaijan has completely blocked the Lachin Corridor, which threatens to deepen the humanitarian crisis in Nagorno-Karabakh.

Speaking on behalf of the Netherlands, the Dutch Foreign Minister expressed deep concern about the blockade and urged the EU to continue negotiations with Azerbaijan to implement the order of the International Court of Justice and guarantee the free movement of people and goods along the corridor.

Joseph Borrell underlined that he called on Azerbaijan to lift the blockade and added that he intends to negotiate with the leaders of Armenia and Azerbaijan in July. All EU member states unanimously supported the President of the European Council in his efforts to reach a peace agreement.

Hellenic and Armenian Caucus members call to condition reported F-16 sales to Turkey, protect US national security



Hellenic and Armenian Caucus members demand that President Joe Biden include snapback provisions on any sale of F-16s to Turkey – empowering the US to call off transfers if/when Turkey renews anti-NATO actions.

Congressman Pappas (NH-01), Co-Chair of the Congressional Hellenic Caucus, in response to **continued reports** of discussions between the United States and Turkey on the sale of F-16s in exchange for Sweden's accession to NATO, led a bipartisan group of lawmakers demanding any agreement for the sale of F-16s and modernization kits to Turkey include mechanisms that provide for the pause, delay, or snapback of those weapons if Turkey engages in actions that threaten U.S. national security interests or the unity of the NATO alliance.

In the letter, the lawmakers wrote, "Given Turkey's history of using American F-16s for overflights in the Aegean and to challenge Greek sovereignty, we request mechanisms that provide for the pause, delay, or snapback of the transfer of American weapons to Turkey if it resumes its destabilizing actions in the Eastern Mediterranean that threaten or undermine U.S. national security interests

or NATO security architecture."

They noted Congress's previous support for a Pappas-led provision attaching conditions to such a sale, writing, "In the 2023 National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA), the House of Representatives passed an amendment which would establish reasonable limitations on the Administration's ability to transfer F-16 aircraft and F-16 modernization kits to Turkey. This provision passed the House on a bipartisan basis and with 73% of Members voting in favor."

The lawmakers concluded, "The Administration has an obligation to ensure that U.S.-provided F-16s are not used to undermine U.S. national security interests, stability in the Eastern Mediterranean, and the NATO alliance."

EU renews call to Azerbaijan to ensure unrestricted movement of people and goods via the Lachin corridor

The EU strongly supports the activities of the ICRC as the only major humanitarian organization present in the South Caucasus, Nabila Massrali, Nabila Massrali, Spokesperson for Foreign Affairs and Security Policy, said in a statement.

"It is providing crucial humanitarian assistance and protection to those in need, in accordance with the humanitarian principles of neutrality, independence and impartiality," she said.



"Their work along the Lachin corridor has been exclusively focused on providing the essential needs for the Armenian population in Karabakh and much needed humanitarian assistance. It is the responsibility of the Azerbaijani authorities to ensure that ICRC can continue its operations and prevent a potential humanitarian crisis," the Spokesperson noted.

"The EU strongly supports the crucial role of the ICRC in the re-gion, and reiterates its call for Azerbai-jan to ensure the unrestricted movement of people and goods via the Lachin corridor," she concluded.

German Minister of State for Foreign Affairs briefed on the process of settlement of Armenia-Azerbaijan relations

On July 13, Armenian Deputy Foreign Minister Paruyr Hovhannisyan met with Tobias Lindner, Minister of State at the German Federal Foreign Office, who is in Armenia as part of a regional visit.

The parties discussed issues related to the bilateral agenda. Thoughts were exchanged on promoting cooperation in spheres of mutual interest, including expanding trade and economic cooperation.

The Deputy Foreign Minister of Armenia and the State Minister of Foreign Affairs of Germany noted that the frequency of bilateral high-level visits testifies to the dynamic development of Armenian-German relations and the high level of political dialogue.

Minister of State Lindner was briefed on the process of settlement of

Armenia-Azerbaijan relations, the security situation in the region and the efforts made by Armenia towards establishing peace. The issues of the rights and security of the people of Nagorno-Karabakh were addressed, the need to eliminate the illegal blocking of the Lachin Corridor, the aggressive rhetoric of Azerbaijan and the threat of using force were emphasized.

The Death of Children in Nagorno-Karabakh is a Consequence of the Azerbaijani Blockade. FM Mirzoyan



YEREVAN — "The 7-month blockade of the Lachine Corridor and total siege of Nagorno-Karabakh people is having an irreversible and devastating impact on the lives of people: NK resident children 3 y/o Leo and 6 y/o Gita died as a consequence of the serious humanitarian situation," tweeted Armenian Foreign Minister Ararat Mirzoyan. "In the 21st century. This should not be tolerated."

The children were found dead in a car in the town of Markatert on July 8 one day

after disappearing from their home in the nearby village of Aghabekalanj.

Their single mother, Vera Narimanyan, left them home alone to go to Martakert to receive sunflower oil and sugar as humanitarian aid. They were gone after she returned to the village about two hours later.

"I spent the whole night searching for them with the police, firefighters and army but didn't find them," Narimanyan told RFE/RL's Armenian Service on July 12.

"I will be devastated for the rest of my life," she said.

The infants were caught on security cameras going to Martakert on foot late on July 7. A town resident found them dead in his car the following morning. He said that one of the car's doors was not locked.

The Karabakh police suggested that

Leo and Gita died in their sleep from vehicular heatstroke.

Azerbaijan tightened the blockade on June 15, completely blocking emergency supplies of food, medicine and other essential items to Karabakh which were carried out, in limited quantities, by Russian peacekeepers and the International Committee of the Red Cross. It thus significantly aggravated the shortages of basic foodstuffs Artsakh rationed since January.

Officials in Stepanakert say they are especially concerned about growing child malnutrition resulting from the blockade.

"When I tell our kids to draw anything they want, they draw fruits because they miss them," the director of a local kindergarten told RFE/RL's Armenian Service on July 13.

Since 12 December 2022 the native Armenian population of Nagorno

Karabakh/Artsakh - 120.000 people, including 30.000 children, have been facing existential threat by Azerbaijan, in total violation of international law, Geneva Convention and despite the ongoing negotiations. The November 2020 ceasefire statement, also signed by Azerbaijan after its devastating attack on Artsakh that left 6.000 dead, is being regularly violated by Azerbaijan. The latter continuously carries acts of aggressions against the native Armenian population of Artsakh and violates the sovereign borders of the Republic of Armenia.

On 22 February, the International Court of Justice (ICJ) of the United Nations ordered Azerbaijan to immediately lift the blockade of the Lachin corridor. The goal of the blockade is obvious – the ethnic cleansing of the indigenous Armenian population of Artsakh. In its resolution adopted in March 2023 the European Parliament calls on the EU Council to impose sanctions against Azerbaijani government officials, if the ICJ's order of 22 February is not immediately implemented. Despite this, and the numerous voices being raised across Europe and around the world, we regretfully observe that the European

Commission continues to congratulate itself on its gas partnership with a dictatorship ranked among the worst on the planet – Azerbaijan. A government that is notorious for its deep-rooted corruption at the highest level, and which hires jihadist mercenaries as a support to its army.

In the name of respect for human rights, the values that European democracies claim to stand for, in the name of the sovereign right of peoples to self-determination and as citizens contributing to the prosperity and influence of the European Union who are concerned about its future, we solemnly ask you to act without delay and

- demand once again that Azerbaijan immediately stops violating the November 9 ceasefire statement and remove the checkpoint on the Hakari-bridge installed in blatant violation of the binding order of the ICJ and international commitments, unblock the Lachin Corridor, secure the free and safe movement of people and goods to and from Artsakh;
 impose economic and political sanctions on Azerbaijan and its leaders for
- impose economic and political sanctions on Azerbaijan and its leaders for non-compliance with international provisions, for the occupation of part of the territory of the Republic of Armenia, for Azerbaijan's war crimes and for the blockade vis-à-vis Artsakh;

- use all your leverage to prevent any control of Baku over Artsakh since this inevitably means the ethnic cleansing of the native Armenian population of Artsakh;

Armenian, Italian archaeologists start excavations of fortress on top of Mount Hatis



The archeological expedition of the Institute of Archeology and Ethnography of the National Academy of Sciences of the Republic of Armenia has started excavations in the territory of the newly discovered fortress on Mount Hatis in Kotayk province, the Ministry of Education, Science, Culture and Sport informs.

The excavations are being carried out based on 2023 memorandum signed between the Ministry and the Gagik Tsarukyan Charity Fund.

The fortress (Shamiram Fortress, Hatis Castle) is located on the conical peak of

Hatis. The width of the walls varies between 2-4.5 m, the height between 1-3 m. It is built from large and medium-sized rough basalt stones. A 3m-wide entrance has been preserved in the eastern wall, with two ramparts on both sides. The main structures of the ancient site stretch along the length of the western enclosure.

A team of six Armenian and Italian archaeologists led by Artur Petrosyan and Roberto Dan carries out the excavations of the castle area.

The data obtained so far allow to date



the ancient site to the Bronze and Iron



Ages, Antiquity and Medieval periods. The discovered archaeological finds include shells from different periods, obsidian arrows from the Bronze Age, an iron spearhead, objects of various stones, iron and bronze jewelry, a cylinder seal (probably 5th century BC) and a silver coin with the image of Alexander the Great.

The excavations are expected to be completed by the end of August.

World-renowned Armenian historian Richard G. Hovhannisyan passed away

World-renowned Armenian scientist, academician of the National Academy of Armenia Richard G. Hovhannisyan passed away on July 10, in the city of Los Angeles, US, at the age of 90, Armenian Center for National and International Studies reports.

He was born and raised in Tulare, near Fresno, California, in a family of Armenian Genocide survivors.

Hovannisian received his B.A. in history (1954) from the University of California, Berkeley, and his M.A. in history (1958) and his Ph.D. (1966) from University of California, Los Angeles (UCLA).

In 1986 Richard G. Hovhannisyan was appointed as the first holder of the Armenian Educational Foundation Endowed

Chair in Modern Armenian History at UCLA. He is the author of the monumental four-volume tome about the First Republic of Armenia (1918-1920), as well as many books on Armenian Genocide.

His son, Raffi Hovannisian, was the first Foreign Minister of the Republic of Armenia
