

Second Armenian-British Military-Political Consultations Held

In London, in the framework of cooperation between the defense ministries of Armenia and the United Kingdom, the second Armenian-British military-political consultations were held. Armenian delegation was led by the First Deputy Defense Minister **Davit Tonoyan**. Results of bilateral cooperation in 2015 have been summed up and its prospects for 2016-2017 discussed. Following the discussions, the First Deputy Defense Minister and the Head of the British delegation, Director of the International Security Policy **Nick Gurr** signed Plan of cooperation between defense ministries of Armenia and the United Kingdom in the field of defense for 2016-2017.

The plan includes two dozen areas that are mostly related to the military education and training, exchange of experience in various fields, etc. For the purpose of review of legislation in the field of defense and security reasoned by the adoption of the recent constitutional changes and taking into account the rich experience of British parliamentary government in these areas, cooperation plan provides British advisory assistance.

The results of the consultations were



summed up at a meeting with the UK Minister of State for Reserves also responsible for International Defence Cooperation **Julian Brazier**.

On the same day the Armenian Defense Ministry delegation met with the Head of Eastern Europe & Central Asia Directorate at the UK Foreign and Commonwealth Office **Michael Tatham**. The sides dis-

cussed issues of bilateral cooperation in the defense sector, international and regional security as well as issues related to the Nagorno-Karabakh conflict. In particular, the situation of the armed conflict was presented.

On January 15 the Armenian delegation met with Stephan Pound, MP, Chair, Armenia All-Party Parliamentary Group.

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Charles Kupchan visits Armenia

President Serzh Sargsyan praised U.S. involvement in the South Caucasus and assistance to Armenia on January 14 when he met with a visiting senior official in the administration of U.S. President Barack Obama.

Charles Kupchan, senior director for European affairs at the U.S. National Security Council, arrived in Yerevan the day after visiting Baku and holding talks with Azerbaijani President Ilham Aliyev.

The Armenian presidential press office said Serzh Sargsyan discussed with Kupchan a wide range of issues, including the Nagorno-Karabakh conflict, broader regional security and Armenia's relations with NATO and the European Union. It quoted Sargsyan as saying that U.S.-Armenian relations have "constantly developed" since the early 1990s.

"The President underscored the importance of the U.S. assistance to Armenia's economic development, reforms, democratization and civil society, as well as the U.S. government's continuous efforts to maintain stability in the region," the office added in a statement.

According to the statement, Kupchan, for his part, praised Armenia's participation in the NATO-led missions in Afghanistan and Kosovo.

Serzh Sargsyan was among some 50 heads of state and government who were invited by Obama to a UN peacekeeping summit held in New York in September. Addressing the summit, the Armenian leader affirmed Yerevan's readiness to join more peacekeeping missions abroad in the near future.

Kupchan also held separate talks in Yerevan with Foreign Minister Edward Nalbandian. The Armenian Foreign Ministry said he described bilateral ties as "strong" and reaffirmed Washington's commitment to "a free, prosperous and secure Armenia at peace with its neighbors."



The official Armenian sources gave no details of Kupchan's discussions with Sarkisian and Nalbandian on the unresolved Karabakh conflict. The issue was also on the agenda of his talks with Aliyev.

The U.S. official visited Azerbaijan more than a month after Obama reportedly sent a letter to Aliyev inviting him to a global nuclear security summit that will begin in Washington on March 31. Aliyev's chief foreign policy aide, Novruz Mammadov, was quoted by Azerbaijani media as saying on Thursday that the letter also contained "thoughts on ways of resolving the Karabakh conflict." Mammadov did not elaborate.

It is not yet known whether Serzh Sargsyan too has been invited to the summit to be hosted by Obama.

The United States co-heads the OSCE's Minsk Group on Karabakh along with Russia and France. Its chief Karabakh negotiator, James Warlick, said earlier this month that the conflicting parties and the three mediating powers should "intensify work towards a negotiated settlement in 2016." "The parties say they are willing. If not now, when?" Warlick said.

Egypt's Ambassador hands credentials to President Sargsyan



On January 15, the newly appointed Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the Arab Republic of Egypt Tarek Ibrahim Muhammad Maati presented his credential to President Serzh Sargsyan.

The President congratulated the Ambassador on the commencement of his diplomatic mission in our country and

expressed hope that during his tenure he will use his experience and knowledge for furthering and strengthening relations of the two friendly states. Serzh Sargsyan noted with satisfaction that in recent years the Armenian-Egyptian relations have entered a new phase and underscored that the existing great potential in the cooperation of the two countries should be utilized to the fullest, which can be considerably boosted by the reciprocal high-level visits, active political dialogue, frequent contacts and cooperation at the intergovernmental and inter-parliamentary levels.

Ambassador Tarek Maati assured that he would do his best to strengthen the relations between the two states and to develop cooperation in all areas of mutual interest. He said that he has already had

discussions with the Armenian colleagues on the possibility of restarting the work of the Armenian-Egyptian intergovernmental commission this year and added that he is hopeful that the activities of the commission will invigorate the trade and economic relations. The Ambassador concurred with the President of Armenia on the issue regarding the necessity to strengthen relations between the legislatures of the two countries and creation of the friendship groups in both Parliaments.

The parties underscored the special role of the Armenian diaspora of Egypt in strengthening the friendly relations between Armenia and Egypt.

The President of Armenia wished success to the newly appointed Ambassador of Egypt throughout his tenure.

Diversion from Azerbaijan: Analyst says Azerbaijan's primary attention off Karabakh due to domestic problems

Azerbaijan is in such a deep and serious economic crisis that it has no time to think about the Nagorno-Karabakh conflict, says head of the Yerevan-based Caucasus Institute Alexander Iskandaryan.

According to the political analyst, the current economic crisis in Azerbaijan will further deteriorate, however it will not result in the cessation of shootings at the Karabakh-Azerbaijan line of contact.

"The Karabakh issue is very useful for Azerbaijan. It would be a very stupid thing for the Azerbaijani authorities to give up that instrument," he told media on January 15.

Political analyst Sergey Minasyan thinks that the Azerbaijani government will not launch large-scale military actions this year, as a situation has been created in which Azerbaijani President Ilham Aliyev's position has weakened domestically.

"And maybe he will not give up its policy of keeping the situation tense at the border, but will not launch large-scale military operations in which the risks are too great. Especially when all the leaders of Azerbaijan before Aliyev had lost their position after the outbreak of hostilities," he told media on Friday.

Meanwhile, the Karabakh military report that last night the Azerbaijani Army's special forces attempted a saboteur raid in



the eastern direction of the contact line. The advanced units of the Karabakh defense army timely spotted the Azeri commandoes' progress and took appropriate preventive measures, the Karabakh Defense Ministry said.

As a result of the engagement two Azerbaijani soldiers were killed. The other members of the group escaped. The Armenian side reported no dead or wounded.

Armenian Ombudsman resigns after 'immoral' attacks



Karen Andreyan, Armenia's state human rights ombudsman, unexpectedly resigned on Tuesday less than three months after accusing government-linked individuals of waging a smear campaign against him.

Andreyan's office announced his resignation in a short statement posted on its Facebook page. It gave no reasons for the move, saying instead that the ombudsman thanked his staff and expressed hope that "human rights protection will remain a priority for our state and society."

"There will be no comment in connec-

tion with this," concluded the statement.

Andreyan, who has served as ombudsman for about five years, did not answer phone calls in the following hours.

The resignation is certain to be linked by many with his recent bitter row with several parliamentarians representing the ruling Republican Party of Armenia (HHK). They attacked Andreyan in late October when he presented the National Assembly with an annual report on the work of his office.

The HHK's Samvel Farmanyan launched a particularly scathing attack on Andreyan, calling the 500-page report "sloppy" and "toothless." Farmanyan, who had previously worked as President Serzh Sargsyan's press secretary, accused

the human rights defender of wasting taxpayers' money and ignoring "reforms" implemented by the government.

Galust Sahakyan, the parliament speaker and a senior HHK figure, effectively defended Farmanyan.

Andreyan rebutted the accusations on the parliament floor, saying that Farmanyan is carrying out an "immoral order" issued by an unspecified person at odds with the ombudsman. He refused to name names, saying only that he did not refer to President Sargsyan.

Under Armenia's recently amended constitution, the next ombudsman will be elected by the parliament. He or she will need to be backed by at least three-fifths of its 131 members.

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No Epidemic: Health officials insist swine flu situation manageable



As of January 14, 11 people died because of complications caused by the virus. The Ministry of Health says that an overwhelming majority of 948 patients currently hospitalized with flu and other respiratory infections are aged below 18.

Of the hospitalized patients 114 are pregnant women, and 92 patients are being treated in intensive care units. At this point, 11 patients are connected to artificial respiration apparatuses and their condition is assessed as critical.

During Thursday's government meeting Health Minister Armen Muradyan again insisted that there is no flu epidemic in Armenia. He said that the significant rise in the number of acute respiratory diseases observed in Armenia in the past 20 days was due to the significant growth of the rate of similar diseases in the European region, which is confirmed by the World Health Organization. In particular, the matter concerns the A type influenza, 56 percent of which, according to the available data,

is due to the H1N1 virus.

The minister said that a rapid response team has been formed and they report to the prime minister about the work done on a daily basis.

"The work has been carried out in two major directions - preventive measures and management of the current situation.

In particular, still in September we organized corresponding courses among medical staffs on fighting the H1N1 virus, about 15,000 people, including vulnerable groups, in particular, people in orphanages, nursing homes, psychiatric hospitals, reception and primary healthcare staff, were vaccinated on a voluntary basis," said Muradyan, adding that services at border crossings also work in an enhanced regime.

Also, polyclinics will remain open over the weekend to accommodate for the possible visits from patients with symptoms of flu or less severe respiratory diseases.

It emerged at the government meeting that school vacations in Armenia will again be extended for a week, till January 25, upon the recommendation of the Ministry of Health.

But health officials still believe that the situation is under control and that based on the current rate of the disease it is very far from being an epidemic.

Many citizens suspect that no epidemic is declared on purpose, as in that case the Ministry would have to provide medical assistance free of charge. But the minister said that the entire process has been organized and conducted within the framework of the state order, regardless of people's social status and privileges.

"All hospitals have been supplied with the necessary medication, which has been provided to patients free of charge," Muradyan said, adding that now anti-flu medicines are also provided for free to patients through polyclinics.

Aliyev's words enough to show Azerbaijan's stance on negotiations: Shavarsh Kocharyan

"The only fact of Aliyev saying that the meeting with Armenian President was formal is enough to show Azerbaijan's position on the negotiations," Armenian Deputy Foreign Minister Shavarsh Kocharyan told reporters after the government sitting on January 14.

"This is enough to understand the stance of the Azerbaijani leadership on the OSCE Minsk Group Co-Chairs and the principles of conflict settlement. Definitely, this is the reason why there has been no progress in the settlement," Kocharyan said.

According to him, progress in the approaches of the parties is important for achieving progress in the negotiations. "Of course, the Co-Chairs try to organize meetings as frequently as possible, but there can be no progress, if Azerbaijan continues to describe them as formal," he added.

The Deputy FM said discussions in Bern were focused on the need to implement a mechanism of investigation of border incidents, as installation of corresponding equipment.

"Although Azerbaijan rejects the proposal, this shows that the



mediators are worried and are seeking new ways of settlement," Shavarsh Kocharyan noted.

The Deputy Foreign Minister made it clear that should these attempts fail, there will be two options left -either imposing peace on Azerbaijan or recognizing the Nagorno Karabakh Republic.

Armenia's UN Amb. elected President of the Executive Board of UNDP, UNFPA and UNOPS



On 11 January, Armenia's Permanent Representative to the United Nations, Ambassador Zohrab Mnatsakanyan was elected President of the Executive Board of the United Nations Development Programme's (UNDP), UN Population Fund (UNFPA) and UN Office for Project Service (UNOPS), the

Organizations' governing body, for a one-year term.

The Executive Board is made up of representatives of Member States and is mandated by the UN General Assembly to provide inter-governmental support to and overall supervision of the activities of UNDP, UNFPA and UNOPS. The Board

meets three times a year ensuring that the three Agencies remain responsive to the evolving needs of programme countries.

"2016 will be a pivotal time for our Board and sister-agencies in light of the recent adoption of the new set of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). The year will also be critical in view of the mid-term review of the strategic plans for 2014-2017, as well as the upcoming discussions of the new cycle of Quadrennial Comprehensive Policy Review, which remains the main political mechanism for member states to assess the effectiveness, efficiency, coherence and impact of the UN development system's support to national development efforts", - stated Ambassador Mnatsakanyan in his acceptance remarks.

Information: Armenia is a member of the Executive Board of the UNDP, UNFPA and UNOPS since 2014. In June 2015, the Board approved the UNDP's and UNFPA's country programme documents for Armenia for the period of 2016-2020.

Russian Church reassures Armenians over Genocide recognition

Responding to an uproar in Armenia, the Russian Orthodox Church clarified on January 11 that its supreme head, Patriarch Kirill, did not deny the 1915 Armenian genocide when he praised the Ottoman Empire's treatment of its Christian minorities.

A spokesman for Kirill said that the influential church continues to believe that the World War One-era slaughter of some 1.5 million Armenians constituted genocide.

The Kremlin-backed Patriarch raised eyebrows in Armenia when he discussed the plight of shrinking Christian communities in the Middle East in a weekend interview with Russian state television. In a clear reference to atrocities committed by Islamist militants, he said Christians in the region are being subjected to genocide.

"Nothing similar to the current events had ever happened in the Islamic world," Kirill said, adding: "Take, for example, the Turkish, Ottoman Empire. Yes, there were Christian minorities there but they were not

exterminated."

The remarks angered many Armenian social media users before being similarly condemned by some political figures. Giro Manoyan of the Armenian Revolutionary Federation (Dashnaksutyun), a major party that has traditionally been sympathetic to Russia, called them "unacceptable."

"Obviously, Christians were not constantly massacred throughout the existence of the Ottoman Empire," Manoyan told RFE/RL's Armenian service. "But failing to see that there were massacres, genocides targeting Armenians, Greeks, Assyrians and other minorities is tantamount to distorting history."

Manoyan urged Armenia's government and the Armenian Apostolic Church to officially react to Kirill's statement.

Rev. Vahram Melikyan, the spokesman for the church, said the Echmiadzin-based office of Catholicos Garegin II expects an explanation from the Russian Church and has already contacted the Moscow

Patriarchate for that purpose.

Melikyan publicized later in the day a statement to the Armenian media released by Kirill's spokesman, Rev. Aleksandr Volkov.

Volkov insisted that the Patriarch alluded to only some periods of Ottoman history that saw "relative security and stability in the lives of religious minorities." "The absence of such order -- both in the Ottoman Empire 100 years ago and in contemporary Iraq, Syria and Libya -- always leads to tragic events," he said.

"The position of our Church on the Armenian genocide has been repeatedly and clearly expressed in numerous statements and messages of the Patriarch," added Volkov. He pointed out that high-level Russian Orthodox clerics took part in last year's events in Armenia that marked the centennial of the Armenian genocide.

Kirill prayed and laid flowers at the Armenian genocide memorial in Yerevan when he visited Armenia in 2010.

EU hopes to complete talks with Armenia by the end of the year

The European Union hopes to conclude by the end of this year ongoing negotiations on a new agreement to deepen its political and economic relations with Armenia, a senior EU diplomat said on January 13.

The talks began in early December more than two years after President Serzh Sargsyan unexpectedly decided to seek Armenia's accession a Russian-led alliance of ex-Soviet states. The move precluded the signing of a far-reaching Association Agreement with the EU.

Yerevan and Brussels subsequently agreed to negotiate a less ambitious accord which would not contradict Armenian membership in the Eurasian Economic Union (EEU). Officials from both sides have said that it will contain many political and even economic provisions of the cancelled Association Agreement.

Serzh Sargsyan and Piotr Switalski, head of the EU Delegation in Yerevan, reportedly discussed the issue when they met on Wednesday. The Armenian presi-



dential press office said Switalski "expressed hope that the Armenia-EU bilateral relations will acquire a new quality in 2016 and negotiations on the new comprehensive Armenia-EU legal document will have been concluded before the end of the year."

A statement by the office quoted Sargsyan as saying that closer ties with the EU remain one of Armenia's foreign policy

priorities. He thanked the EU for its economic assistance to Armenia and said he expects such support for new "large-scale reforms" planned by his government.

The EU allocated 30 million euros (\$33 million) in fresh aid to Yerevan as recently as on December 16. It said that the money will mainly finance reforms designed to streamline Armenia's labor market and boost public oversight of its finances.

EBRD Investments in Armenia hit record high

The European Bank for Reconstruction and Development (EBRD) said on January 15 that its investments in Armenia, mostly channeled into the private sector, reached a record high of \$140 million last year.

The London-based institution supporting economic reforms in former Communist states said it financed 14 business projects implemented in various sectors of the Armenian economy.

The EBRD thus accounted for a considerable part of foreign direct investment (FDI) attracted by the South Caucasus country in 2015. The Armenian government recorded \$263 million in FDI inflows in January-September.

In a statement circulated by its Yerevan office, the bank described the record-high figure as a "clear indication of both the investment opportunities in the country and strong demand for EBRD funding." "The EBRD's ability to attract increasing financial resources to Armenia is testament to the bankability of our clients and the overall investment climate in Armenia," the head of the office, Mark

Davis, was quoted as saying.

"While 2016 is likely to be a challenging year, I see a number of new opportunities in Armenia to add to our client base, and several deal prospects are already maturing," added Davis. "Overall I am optimistic, especially about capital market development and the emergence of more private equity investment activity."

The EBRD has invested a total of \$1.13 billion in about 150 projects in Armenia ever since it began operating in the country in 1992. Nearly 90 percent of those investments have gone into the private sector, largely taking the form of minority stake purchases in local banks and other firms as well as foreign corporations setting up shop in the country.

As recently as on December 10, the EBRD paid just over \$20 million for a 22.7 percent share in Armenia's Inecobank. The deal was tied to Inecobank's acquisition of ProCredit Bank Armenia. The two banks have thousands of small and medium-sized businesses among their clients. Their merger



meant a further consolidation of the Armenian banking sector strongly supported by the EBRD.

Local commercial banks have absorbed nearly half of the EBRD's total investments in Armenia. The EBRD has also invested in the country's energy, agribusiness, mining and transport sections as well as public infrastructure.

On December 11, the EBRD announced the release of a \$9 million loan for the construction of a solid waste landfill in Yerevan meeting European Union standards. The project also received about \$18 million in funding from the EU.

Massacre of Armenians in Baku remembered 26 years later

The massacre of Armenians started on January 13, 26 years ago and continued for a week. Those guilty for the events of 1990 have not been punished; the exact number of the victims is still unknown. What's obvious, however, is that the real number considerably exceeds the official data.

The events in Baku 26 years ago were real genocide against the Armenian population. Tens of Armenians were killed in Baku between January 13 and 20. They



were robbed of their property and exiled.

"More than a quarter of century after the massacre, the events have not been properly assessed," President of the Assembly of Azerbaijani Armenians Grigory Ayvazyan told reporters on January 13.

"The neighboring country glorifies the organizers and perpetrators of the crime. Even today killing an Armenia is not seen as a crime in Azerbaijan. Azerbaijan brings up generations on the example of cut-throats and murderers," he said.

"The massacre of Armenians is a serious counterargument for all those, who try to imagine Artsakh under Azerbaijani jurisdiction. In this case the reoccurrence of ethnic cleansings will be unavoidable. Remembering Baku



and Sumgait, we'll not allow the same in Artsakh," sociologist Aharon Adibekyan said.

According to him, the book titled "Armenophobia in Azerbaijan" will soon be released. The book, which has been translated into English, tells about the Armenian massacres in Baku and Sumgait and their consequences. Adibekyan said "we must make it clear to the world who we have to deal with in the face of Azerbaijan."

An unsung American hero to be honored for saving 250,000 people during the Armenian Genocide


Asa Kent Jennings was an American hero who saved 250,000 people during the Armenian Genocide.

Despite his awe-inspiring life-saving deeds, his story has not been properly recognized, not only around the world, but also in the USA and in Armenia.

The Board of the International Raoul Wallenberg Foundation has resolved to pay tribute to his legacy in a series of activities that will be made public soon.

Jennings was a small-town handicapped Minister originally from upstate New York. At the beginning of the 20th century he worked in the affluent city of Smyrna in Turkey, as a YMCA employee.

In September 1922, the Turkish nationalist army entered the city with the intent of slaughtering all its Christian residents, mostly Armenians and Greek. A huge blaze erupted through the city on September 13, trapping scores of refugees in a narrow strip by the sea. Hundreds of thousands were doomed to die on the city's



waterfront. Many of them were succumbing to plagues, hunger and thirst, under the Turkish siege.

Aware of their plight, Jennings had set-up a first-aid station for pregnant women in an empty home on the waterfront. He then organized a fleet of ships with the help of the US Navy in an audacious and imaginative rescue plan.

The Jennings evacuation removed

250,000 refugees from Smyrna and relocated them to the Greek Islands and the cities of Thessaloniki and Piraeus.

This blitz operation took only 7 days, to meet a Turkish city amidst threats of deportation. His courage and shrewdness saved the lives of a quarter million innocent human beings from a terrible death.

Asa Kent Jennings is a great American rescuer who went out of his way to save scores of Armenians and Greeks and his legacy needs to be divulged for the world to know that people like him were not indifferent to the plight of other human beings.

His spirit of solidarity should be a beacon of hope and should teach us that one man can make a difference.

The IRWF decision to commemorate the feats of Asa Jennings are in the framework of the NGO's research efforts aimed at discovering the brave women and men who reached-out to the Armenians in their suffering.

The White House should answer 10 key questions on Artsakh

For many years, the Armenian-American community has been dissatisfied with United States policy on Artsakh (Nagorno Karabagh).

Under the guise of neutrality, OSCE Minsk Group Co-Chair James Warlick and his predecessors have put the blame on both sides of the conflict each time that Azerbaijan has opened fire on Armenia and Artsakh. Such an unfair approach has encouraged Pres. Aliyev to escalate his attacks.

To eliminate or at least minimize such bloody aggression, 85 members of Congress recently signed a joint letter urging the Obama Administration to implement the following three steps regarding the border between the two countries:

1. withdraw the snipers;
2. increase the number of international monitors; and
3. deploy gunfire locators. Not surprisingly, Azerbaijan has rejected all three proposals, while Armenia, Artsakh, and the Minsk Group of mediators (France, Russia, and United States) have accepted them.

Last week, House Foreign Affairs Committee Chairman Ed Royce held a classified briefing with Amb. Warlick concerning the implementation of the proposals which he and Cong. Eliot Engel had initiated. Before the closed-door meeting, the Armenian National Committee of America (ANCA) had circulated a set of 10 suggested questions for Amb. Warlick. While it not known if these questions were raised during the congressional briefing, the Obama Administration should be asked to respond publicly to the 10 questions so that everyone becomes aware of its position on the Artsakh conflict.

To ensure that an official answer is

received, I suggest the posting of these questions on the White House website, under the "Petitions" section. The website states that the Obama Administration will issue a formal response in 60 days to any petition that gathers over 100,000 signatures within 30 days of its posting. Azeris have already taken advantage of this unique opportunity by posting on the White House website two anti-Armenian petitions which gathered 105,686 and 126,828 signatures respectively. As expected, the White House did issue a statement in response to the two Azeri petitions.

Below are the 10 ANCA questions which should be posted as a petition on the White House website:

1. What specific steps, if any, has the U.S. government taken to ensure the implementation of the Royce-Engel peace proposals, specifically with regard to an agreement on the non-deployment of snipers, the addition of observers, and the deployment of gunfire locator systems along the line of contact?

2. The State Department has been both very vocal and highly specific about what it believes the Armenian side must concede. Is the U.S. government willing to match this public diplomacy with equally high-profile and similarly concrete demands upon Azerbaijan?

3. What are the specific facts, legal arguments, and policy considerations that led our government to officially recognize Kosovo but not Nagorno Karabakh?

4. Does the Azerbaijani government's record of domestic repression and corruption in any way impact how our government views Azerbaijan's claim to extend its

governance over Nagorno Karabakh?

5. Why has Azerbaijan's well documented and video-taped destruction of the medieval Armenian Cemetery in Djulfa never been mentioned in either the State Department's Human Rights or Religious Freedom reports?

6. What is the U.S. government's current request, if any, regarding the re-incarceration of admitted and still unrepentant axe-murderer Ramil Safarov?

7. What is the U.S. policy concerning the Azerbaijani government's travel restrictions related to U.S. citizens of Armenian heritage?

8. What is the U.S. policy regarding NATO member states, notably Turkey, making sales or transfers of advanced, offensive weaponry to Azerbaijan?

9. What specific restrictions exist regarding travel and communication between the citizens and officials of the United States and Nagorno Karabakh? What are the justifications for any such restrictions of these freedoms? What, if any, are the perceived benefits of such restrictions?

10. What interests do you believe have been served, if any, by official U.S. public restraint in challenging Azerbaijan's high-profile anti-Armenian incitements, threats, and cross-border aggression?

I believe that a well-publicized petition can gather much more than 100,000 signatures within 30 days of its posting on the White House website, particularly if prominent individuals with a large number of followers endorse the petition.

Canadian Armenian community maintains support for Syrian refugees

By the time 10,000 Syrian refugees have arrived in the country, Canadians will have fine-tuned their welcome act into a national ritual.

January 12 was expected to be the day that the 10,000th Syrian refugee arrives in Canada. Two planes carrying 465 refugees were scheduled to arrive at Toronto Pearson International Airport sometime Tuesday, although it's not known when they will land. Pearson reported some flight cancellations and delays due to snowy weather conditions earlier in the day.

A plane carrying 155 was also bound for Montreal.

When they land, hundreds of volunteers and aid workers will have already arranged shelter, food and clothing for their first night in Canada. Most refugees who land in Toronto will stay at a hotel such as the Toronto Plaza Hotel in North York, where they will find a hot meal and even winter coats.

From there, many will be picked up by volunteer private sponsors who have helped set them up with an apartment and guarantee their financial security for at least one year.

About half of the refugees who have arrived so far have been privately sponsored by groups such as the Armenian Community Centre of Toronto. Since Dec. 10, when the first plane arrived, the centre has accepted more than 700 refugees, says one of the refugee sponsorship organizers, Apkhar Mirakian.

It was during that first arrival, Mirakian said, that the refugees started what became a kind of welcome tradition. Instead of bee-lining for the community centre, where they would meet their sponsor family, they headed straight to the adjacent church.

"They wanted to go to the church, because they had to thank God and Canada. God because he gave them an opportunity for living now, and Canada because it gave them an opportunity to live in Canada," Mirakian said.

Mirakian said that volunteers have been doing everything to make sure the Syrian's transition to Canadian life is as



smooth as possible, but that there are no guarantees.

"I hope there won't be any regrets, when they don't find a job or they come into difficulty. We're trying to keep them - nobody falls through the wire mesh, we're trying to hold them all together," Mirakian said.

The biggest obstacles facing refugees right now are finding shelter and work.

"The rest will fall into place, when they're working and have a place to live."

Right now, most refugees are spending their first night in Canada at a hotel near the airport. But when vacancies run out - possibly as early as next week - refugees will be headed to Canadian Forces Bases Valcartier, Kingston and Borden.

Space is available for 6,000 people at various bases and facilities throughout Ontario and Quebec, with an additional 7,000 spots also in reserve if needed, the Forces say on their website.

The Red Cross is working with the government to prepare the bases in advance. Chiran Livera, a spokesperson for the organization, said the Red Cross Canada doesn't expect any refugees to arrive at the military in the next few days, but that they are prepared to welcome them as soon as they are needed.

"We've been on the bases for the last couple of weeks now," Livera said. "We're ready to go."

It might not be ideal - escaping war-torn Syria only to spend your first few nights on a military base. But Livera said

the facility is well equipped and provides a lot of services, such as private rooms, recreational facilities and internet access.

"In that sense it's like a little town," he said. "For sure there will be soldiers there doing their regular work that they normally do, but I think everyone is there to support the refugees and they will receive a very hospitable welcome."

Approximately 70 Canadian Armed Forces members have returned from Jordan and Lebanon, where they were part of a broader government effort to bring 25,000 Syrians to Canada by the end of next month.

"All it takes is seeing one little one the same age as my daughter - smiling because they are going to Canada," said Maj. Drew Willis, who was among 68 soldiers who arrived to waiting family members early Tuesday at Canadian Forces Base Gaagetown in New Brunswick.

About 150 soldiers remain overseas helping process applications and conduct medical tests on the thousands of Syrians who are still passing through the screening process.

Mirakian, who is of Armenian origin, said that when he immigrated to Canada in 1967 he was overwhelmed by the help that Canadians gave him, and he wants to repay the favour.

"That's why I want to help, that's why I'm here. Because I'm a Canadian of Armenian origin and Canada has always taught me to be a different man than the rest of the world," he said.

Picasso's granddaughter to sell works for £10m



More than 180 ceramics and drawings by Picasso, kept in his studio in his lifetime and never before offered to the public, are to be sold by his granddaughter, The Telegraph reports.

Marina Picasso is to offer 70 ceramic and terracotta sculptures for sale at Sotheby's, along with 106 works on paper

said to provide a "masterview overview of Picasso's career in its entirety".

Estimates for each item range from £4,000 to £180,000, with the entire collection expected to sell for up to £9.8 million.

Ms Picasso, 65, is the daughter of the artist's eldest son Paulo and inherited

around 10,000 pieces from his estate in 1975.

In June, an auction of 126 ceramics from her portion of the estate also sold through Sotheby's to secure a £12.3m million total.

Last week, Ms Picasso told the Wall Street Journal: "This is part of my history, so I want them to sell well, and prices right now are strong at auction."

Helena Newman, co-head of impressionist and modern art worldwide at the auction house, said: "This wonderful collection presents an intimate view of the artist in his moments of creation, as though we are standing at Picasso's shoulder, able to observe his creative process as he reinvented himself as an artist over and over again."

"Picasso's drawings and unique ceramics allow one to get right up close to the artist at the very genesis of the development of many of his core elemental themes."

They will be offered for sale in London on February 5.

Armenian and Iranian contemporary music to be presented in 5 cities of Iran

The Concert Tour of well-known pianist Hayk Melikyan, an Honored Artist of Armenia, will be launching starting from January 13, 2016 in five biggest cities of the Islamic Republic of Iran.

He will be having 6 recitals which are organized by the New Music Center of Tehran in cooperation with the Governmental entities of the Country.

Hayk Melikyan will mainly be presenting the contemporary music by Armenian (Tigran Mansuryan, Arthur Akshelyan and others) and Iranian (Amir Mahyar Tafreshipour, Hormoz and Shahin Farhaz and others) composers and will also include some of the world-known European ones: Heinz Holliger, Michel Karsky, Toru Takemitsu and others.

There will be several premieres during the concert tour and Hayk Melikyan will also conduct special master classes for Iranian students in all the above mentioned cities.

After the return of the Pianist from Iran, he will give a recital for the Yerevan audience, which will launch the 2016 Concert Season of KOMITAS Museum Institute on January 29.

Avedis Cebeciyán: An Armenian doctor in World War I

The book, titled "Bir Ermeni Subayın Çanakkale ve Dogu Cephesi Günlüğü 1914-1918" (The Journal of an Armenian Military Officer at the Çanakkale and Eastern Front, 1914-1918), which includes Dr. Avedis Cebeciyán's memories of the war, has been translated into Turkish, Today's Zaman reports. The book was originally written in Armenian and published in Beirut in 1986.

The book reveals another perspective of the war and contains some of Cebeciyán's insights. Some moments of the battle, bombardments by Allied countries and tents set up for those injured in the war are among the moments covered in the book by the Armenian doctor.

Cebeciyán states in the book that the Deportation Law, which was enacted on May 27, 1915, came as another tragic incident Ottoman Armenians suffered during the war. Cebeciyán describes the situation of those who suffered due to the deportation policy, as his family members, including his pregnant wife, were deported to Syria in 1915.

In a journal entry dated Aug. 13, 1915, Cebeciyán wrote: "An enemy aircraft bombed us three times today. One of the bombs landed four meters away from my tent. I wasn't in the tent and the bomb didn't explode. It just got stuck in the ground and we dug it out. There are many injured people here. It's painful to witness the



sufferings of thousands of people and not being able to do anything for them but transfer them [to hospitals]. We have transferred 11,000 wounded in the last three days and there isn't enough space on the ships for all of them. I have spent most nights without any sleep carrying out the transfers."

"The bombardment has finally ended. However, a ship has caught on fire. I stood up on a steep mountain, and called to the soldiers, saying: 'Come on, this is a day to serve the country. Come to [extinguish] the fire!'" Cebeciyán wrote in another entry dated Sept. 3, 1915.

Cebeciyán attended the American University of Beirut with the encouragement of his father, Hovhannes Cebeciyán - one of the Armenian gentry in Gaziantep province, and graduated as a doctor. After serving in Sanliurfa for a while, he continued to work at the Sev Gaziantep American Hospital. He also served in Germany and Switzerland to gain more experi-

ence and specialize in his profession. The Adana massacre of 1909, which resulted in the death of 20,000-30,000 Armenians and 1,300 Arameans (Syriacs), broke out when his wife was pregnant with their first child. Cebeciyán decided to return to Gaziantep, his hometown, because things were becoming unbearable for him after his father-in-law was killed on his way to Osmaniye.

Cebeciyán heard that many of his relatives had been killed while he was treating those who were injured during World War I. His brother, Kirkor, had been banished to Syria and was able to come back only after the war. He returned to Syria's Aleppo Governorate after the Armistice of Mudros was signed on Oct. 30, 1918. He earned a living by establishing a clinic with his brother-in-law, Filip Hovnanyan, who was also a doctor. He treated those who were injured during the 1915 Armenian massacres and worked at the clinic until 1952, two years before his death.

Holy Resurrection Chapel of Swaziland transferred to Catholicosate of Etchmiadzin

On January 13, King Msvati III of Swaziland officially transferred the Holy Resurrection Armenian Chapel and the lands pertaining to the Chapel to the Catholicosate of Etchmiadzin.

“Armenpress” reports, citing the source of the Ministry of Diaspora “Hayern Aysor”.

A year ago, representatives of the local Armenian community submitted to King Msvati III of Swaziland a petition with the request to transfer the Holy Resurrection Church to the Catholicosate of Etchmiadzin. A year later, the Armenian chapel of Swaziland truly became an Armenian chapel and one that will legally

pertain to the Catholicosate from now on.

The Armenian Church in the distant African kingdom was constructed in 1989, thanks to Grigor Derbelyan.

Grigor Derbelyan, citizen of Swaziland, was born in 1914 in Aintab. During the Armenian Genocide, with her 20-day-old son in her hands, Grigor’s mother reached her husband in Cairo by foot and died a couple of months later. Finishing his studies at the Armenian university in Cairo, for 12 years, Grigor worked in Khartum (Sudan) where there was quite a large Armenian community. Later, he started working for the Olivetti company in Johannesburg, South African

Republic.

When he matured, Grigor Derbelyan decided to settle in Swaziland where, according to him, he discovered a wonderful place called Pine Valley, which is not far from Mbaban, the capital of Swaziland. Seeing the place, Grigor decided that it is here where he wants to spend the rest of his life and die.

In the center of Pine Valley, the landscape of which reminded him of Armenia, Grigor purchased an 11-acre land, built a small Armenian chapel and plants 1,770 pine and fir trees. A small river flows beside the chapel. Grigor referred to the river as the Arax River and even placed a panel named “Arax River”. Construction of the church was launched in 1985 and ended in 1989.

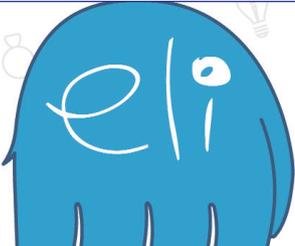
About 60 people made contributions for construction of the chapel, including Olivetti Company, which hired Grigor for 12 years.

The small church has two cupolas.

Local construction materials were used to build the chapel. Interestingly, the part in the back of the chapel leans on a large stone that serves as an altar, like the Saint Geghard Church in Armenia.

Today, there is a small Armenian community of eight members in the small African Kingdom. The Armenians of the neighboring South African Republic help the Armenians of Swaziland care for the chapel and the lands pertaining to the chapel.





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
