

**US and Armenia reiterate commitment to strengthening bilateral ties**



*On the occasion of the final session of the Armenia-US Strategic Dialogue (May 2-3), the sides issued the following joint statement.*

U.S. Secretary of State Antony J. Blinken hosted Armenian Foreign Minister Ararat Mirzoyan in Washington, D.C., to launch the U.S.-Armenia Strategic Dialogue (USASD) on May 2, 2022.

During the Dialogue, the United States and Armenia reiterated their commitment to strengthening bilateral ties across the breadth of the bilateral relationship.

This round of USASD discussions coincided with the 30th anniversary of the establishment of U.S.-Armenian diplomatic relations. The delegations positively assessed the status of bilateral ties and reviewed the potential for expanding our partnership. The Armenian delegation included Deputy Minister of Justice Grigor Minasyan, Deputy Central Bank Governor Nerses Yeritsyan, and Ministry of Defense officials. Assistant Secretary of State for European and Eurasian Affairs Dr. Karen Donfried and several leaders from throughout the Departments of State and Defense also participated in the USASD session.

U.S. Ambassador to Armenia Lynne Tracy was in Washing-

ton as well, joined by Armenian Ambassador to the United States Lilit Makunts.

**Further Democratic Reforms and Promote Mutual Prosperity**

Assistant Secretary Donfried reaffirmed the United States would continue its robust assistance and cooperation to the Armenian government in building responsive democratic and economic institutions that both reflect our common values and deliver better governance and prosperity.

The delegations had a robust dialogue on U.S. assistance to support Armenia's positive democratic trajectory. This includes programs to support human rights, media literacy, social protection, justice sector reforms, and the new Patrol Police Service. The delegations also discussed advancing judicial impartiality and strengthening freedom of expression. Mechanisms to promote mutual prosperity in the economic sphere were also a key topic of discussion, including energy cooperation and workforce development to promote and deepen bilateral trade and investment.

## Secretary of Armenia's Security Council, Georgian PM discuss bilateral relations, regional issues

Georgian Prime Irakli Garibashvili held a meeting with Armen Grigoryan, Secretary of the Security Council of the Republic of Armenia.

The parties discussed the good-neighborly relations between Georgia and Armenia, along with directions for future cooperation.

The Head of Government thanked Armen Grigoryan for his visit and emphasized the importance of ensuring peace and

It was underlined that, in order to further the bilateral relations, Georgia remains committed to contributing to regional dialogue for fostering economy, trade, culture, and other directions. The conversation also touched on the Prime Minister's peaceful neighborhood initiative.

The parties also discussed the ongoing military action in Ukraine.

The meeting at the Government Ad-



ministration was attended by Arshak Muskhanyan, Adviser to the Secretary of the National Security Council of the Republic of Armenia, and by Georgia's Interior Minister/Secretary of the National Security Council Vakhtang Gomelauri.

## Ruben Rubinyan briefs Ambassadors accredited to Armenia on normalization with Turkey

Vice President of the National Assembly Ruben Rubinyan received the Ambassadors and the representatives of the Embassies of the Members States of the European Union, as well as the U.S., the UK and Switzerland accredited to Armenia, Press Service of the National Assembly reports.

The sides referred to the process of normalization of Armenia-Turkey relations and the regional developments.

In this context, Ruben Rubinyan presented the position and the priorities of the Republic of Armenia, emphasizing the need for the support of the international community in these issues.

Please accept, Mr. Prime Minister, my best wishes for peace and prosperity to you and the people of Israel.”

The two delegations discussed issues related to border security, and partnership in the defense and security sector through disaster management, defense reform, medical support, and peacekeeping. The delegations exchanged views on security matters and noted the United States' role as a Co-Chair of the OSCE Minsk Group, which has a mandate to facilitate a peaceful resolution of the Nagorno-Karabakh conflict.

**Looking To Tangible Results**

Minister Mirzoyan and the Armenian delegation also had constructive meetings with USAID Administrator Samantha Power, Under Secretary of State for Political Affairs Victoria Nuland, and many others. During their time in Washington, delegation members signed a number of documents, including a Nuclear Cooperation Memorandum of Understanding that will serve as a mechanism through which our governments can develop stronger ties

between our nuclear experts, industries, and researchers. The United States and Armenia also signed two joint action plans on anti-corruption and law enforcement reforms.



## Armenia's proposals handed over to Azerbaijan in Brussels include the status, security of Artsakh – Ambassador-at-large

There is no legal ground that at any time any de-jure Azerbaijani enclave has existed in the territory of Armenia, Armenia's Ambassador at-large Edmon Marukyan told *Armenpress*.

The comments come after Deputy Foreign Minister of Azerbaijan Khalafov said that on April 6 in Brussels the Republic of Armenia agreed to launch peace treaty negotiations with Azerbaijan based on the 5 points presented by Azerbaijan. The Azerbaijani Foreign Minister made a similar statement.

"We've addressed this topic on many occasions. Back on March 21, 2022 the Minister of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Armenia said: 'There is nothing unacceptable for us in the proposals handed over to us by Azerbaijan on March 10. It is another matter that these proposals do not address all issues of the Armenia-Azerbaijani comprehensive peace agenda. We supplemented the agenda with our response handed over to the OSCE MG Co-Chairmanship and therefore we are ready for the launch of the peace talks based on this'."

Edmon Marukyan said.

"During the trilateral meeting in Brussels on April 6 the Republic of Armenia also [directly] handed over to the Azerbaijani side the 6-point document which includes, among others, the issues of the security and the protection of the rights of the Armenians of Nagorno Karabakh and the final status of Nagorno Karabakh. The Armenian side offered to start negotiations based on the two agendas in the direction of a peace treaty. The Azerbaijani side agreed to this approach, after which an agreement was reached to initiate negotiations on a peace treaty," he added.

Azerbaijani Deputy FM's statement

on what he called "the return of seven villages of the Ghazakh district and Kyarki to Azerbaijan," the Ambassador-at-large said: "we've said on different occasions that the delimitation and demarcation processes should take place based on facts and documents of de-jure significance. At this moment we don't possess any legal substantiation that any de-jure Azerbaijani enclave has ever existed in the territory of Armenia. On the contrary, there are legal grounds on the village of Artsvashen belonging to Armenia. The same applies to a number of territories belonging to Armenia, including in the Sotk-Khoznavar section where the infamous unlawful Azerbaijani military invasion took place in May last year. These issues must certainly be discussed and resolved in the delimitation and demarcation process."

## Russia interested in soonest stabilization in Armenia – Peskov



The developments in Armenia are the domestic affair of the country, but Moscow is interested in the soonest settlement of

the situation, Kremlin Spokesman Dmitry Peskov told TASS.

"This is entirely an internal affair of Armenia," Peskov said, referring to opposition rallies in the country.

He stressed that Yerevan is an ally of Moscow. "Armenia is our ally, it is our partner in several very important integration formats, Armenia is our great friend," Peskov said.

"Therefore, of course, we are interested in seeing this period end in Armenia as

soon as possible and a period of stability begin again, which will allow us to gradually move towards the implementation of the trilateral agreements on Karabakh that were finalized with the participation of the President of Russia, as well as develop our bilateral relations, in general," the Kremlin Spokesman said.

The opposition has been holding protests in Armenia since mid-April, demanding the resignation of Prime Minister Nikol Pashinyan.

## PM Pashinyan receives the delegation of the France-Armenia Friendship Group in the French Senate

Prime Minister Nikol Pashinyan received the delegation led by Gilbert-Luc Devinaz, Head of the France-Armenia Friendship Group of the French Senate.

The Prime Minister welcomed the visit of the delegation to Armenia and praised their contribution to the development and strengthening of the Armenian-French relations. Nikol Pashinyan added that the legislative and executive bodies of the two countries cooperate closely, to which the friendship group has a great contribution. **“Your visits to our country give a great and positive impetus to the continuous strengthening of the Armenian-French partnership,”** PM Pashinyan said.



Gilbert-Luc Devinaz thanked for the warm reception, emphasizing that in the future, likewise, efforts will be directed to the development of bilateral partnership. **“We will continue to stand by Armenia and Artsakh”**, the Head of the France-Armenia Friendship Group of the

French Senate said, recalling that the resolution of the French Senate calling to recognize Artsakh’s independence received wide support from the senators.

Prime Minister Pashinyan noted that the resolution adopted by the Senate has a huge political significance, which gives great strength and confidence in the context of international recognition of the rights of the Armenians of Artsakh.

During the meeting, the sides touched upon issues related to the return of Armenian prisoners of war, hostages and other civilians held in Azerbaijan, the situation around Nagorno Karabakh, humanitarian issues, as well as issues related to the development of democracy in Armenia.

## Armenian Foreign Minister holds discussion at Atlantic Council



Foreign Minister of Armenia Ararat Mirzoyan, who is in the United States on a working visit, participated as a keynote speaker in a roundtable discussion held at the prestigious US think tank – Atlantic Council.

The Foreign Minister of Armenia

touched upon the main agenda and emphases of the working visit to the USA, the Armenia-US Strategic Dialogue, the documents signed during the visit and the prospects of the development of the Armenian-American relations.

Reference was made to the process of reforms aimed at democratic development, protection of human rights, strengthening the rule of law and the fight against corruption.

Ararat Mirzoyan presented the situation around the Nagorno-Karabakh conflict, Armenia’s position on the negotiations on a comprehensive peace agreement with Azerbaijan, and the role of the OSCE

Minsk Group Co-Chairmanship in these processes.

The humanitarian issues resulting from the 44-day war and need to be urgently addressed were presented.

During the meeting reference was also made to the process of normalization of relations between Armenia and Turkey.

### PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, the word “genocide” was first coined by Polish lawyer Raphael Lemkin in 1944 consisting of the Greek prefix *genos*, meaning race or tribe, and the Latin suffix *cide*, meaning killing, to describe the systematic destruction of all or a significant part of a racial, ethnic, religious or national group by destroying a group’s political and social institutions, culture, language, national feelings, religion and economic existence, and destroying the personal security, liberty, health, dignity and lives of individuals belonging to the group; and

WHEREAS, in 1946, following World War II, genocide was first recognized by the United States Congress...

“The systematic destruction of lives has spanned areas and cultures from Armenia to Darfur, the Holodomor to the Holocaust,” he added. “Genocide has no place in society, and we must do everything we can to prevent it,” the Governor said.



**(RFE/RL) - Prime Minister Nikol Pashinyan rejected opposition demands for his resignation and again blamed Armenia's former leaders for the 2020 war in Nagorno-Karabakh on May 4 amid continuing anti-government protests in Yerevan.**

Pashinyan said the Armenian opposition is trying in vain to replicate the “velvet revolution” that brought him to power in 2018.

“They think that if they repeat everything, do things the same way, mimic, they will succeed,” he said during his government’s question-and-answer session in the Armenian parliament.

Opposition supporters again blocked streets and marched through various parts of Yerevan before converging on its France Square, the epicenter of the daily protests, early in the afternoon. Thousands of demonstrators then headed to the parliament compound where Pashinyan answered questions from lawmakers.

Scores of riot police were deployed around the walled compound to keep the protesters from approaching the main en-

trance to the National Assembly. Heeding repeated appeals from opposition leaders, the crowd did not attempt to break through the police cordon during an hour-long standoff with the security forces.

Citing “credible information,” Armenia’s National Security Service (NSS) claimed earlier in the day that organizers of the protests are planning to seize the parliament. Opposition leaders shrugged off the claim.

“They are intimidating citizens with false claims so that citizens do not express their civic position,” one of them, Gegham Manukyan, told RFE/RL’s Armenian Service.

Manukyan and other deputies representing the opposition Hayastan and Pativunem alliances went into the parliament building to attend the government’s question-and-answer session. In a statement read out on behalf of them, Hayastan’s Armen Rustamyan reiterated the opposition demands for Pashinyan’s resignation.

Rustamyan charged that the prime minister mishandled peace talks with Azerbaijan and “brought war and defeat upon us” in 2020. He also accused Pashinyan of breaking 2021 election campaign promises, including a pledge to assert the Karabakh Armenians’ right to self-determination.

Pashinyan is now prepared to help Azerbaijan regain full control over Karabakh, Rustamyan said, reiterating allega-

tions that are at the heart of the ongoing opposition campaign to topple the government.

“Nikol Pashinyan is not legitimate, does not have a mandate to lead our country to new concessions and must resign,” added the opposition leader.

Pashinyan responded by again saying that Karabakh peace talks were botched by former President Serzh Sargsyan.

“It was Serzh Sargsyan who spoke about the war from this podium by saying that ‘we must no longer hope that Azerbaijan will not try to resolve the Karabakh problem through war,’” he said.

“If you think that you can justify the disasters brought by you upon this country by putting the blame on the former authorities, you are mistaken,” Rustamyan shot back before he and other opposition deputies walked out in protest.

Some of those lawmakers chanted “Armenia without Nikol!” as they left the chamber. Their colleagues from the ruling Civil Contract party applauded them mockingly.

Ishkhan Saghatelyan, another opposition leader who led the crowd outside the parliament building, said the protests will continue unabated.

“We will keep chasing him until he quits,” Saghatelyan told the protesters after Pashinyan left the heavily guarded building.

## Justice Minister favors keeping parliamentary system, implementing reforms and corrections

Minister of Justice Karen Andreasyan says he favors the parliamentary system of government.

Speaking at the first joint session of the Constitutional Reforms Council and Commission, Andreasyan said at some point the members of the council should make a choice on which system of government they favor.

“It is clear that we as experts understand that there could be various types of parliamentary systems, but at some point, a choice must be made and we must choose what the basis should be, and then go for the mixed modern models and solutions.



On this occasion I am officially announcing on behalf of myself and the ministry that I am in favor of maintaining the parliamentary model and making corrections and reforms to this model,” Andreasyan said, emphasizing that this position is not

the official government position yet.

He added that preliminarily, 4 members of the council are in favor with some reservations for the parliamentary system, 1 member favors the presidential system, while 3 others are absent from the discussion and another 3 refused to express an opinion at this moment.

“This summary doesn’t predetermine anything. I simply want us to periodically make some summaries for ourselves so that the public sees how our approaches change after specialized discussions,” Andreasyan said.

## Precision Agriculture Center with drone training lab opens at Agrarian University of Armenia

The Precision Agriculture Center with a drone training laboratory was opened on May 6 at the National Agrarian University of Armenia.

The laboratory was set up and furnished within the framework of the European Union-funded Green Agriculture Initiative (EU-GAIA) project, which is co-funded by the Austrian Development Cooperation.

The Agradrons Laboratory will serve university students and lecturers for research purposes, as well as farmers and



professionals for production and training purposes.

“The EU is glad that Armenian farmers and students of the Agrarian University now have the opportunity to learn these technologies and use them for educational and production purposes. Innovation is the key to sustainable rural development: through innovation, EU and Armenia can maintain the competitiveness of the agri-food sector and create more and better jobs in rural areas, all the while safe-guarding the planet for future generations,” the EU Delegation to Armenia said in a Facebook post.

## Armenia reports spike in citizenship requests



The number of foreigners applying for Armenian citizenship has more than tripled since the start of the war in Ukraine, according to immigration authorities in Yerevan.

Ara Fidanyan, a deputy chief of the Armenian police, told lawmakers on May 3 that the authorities received 3,278 citi-

zenship requests from February 24 through April 20, compared with 941 such applications filed in the same period of last year.

The number of applications totaled 8,591 in the whole of 2021, said Fidanyan. The bulk of them were submitted by ethnic Armenian citizens of other countries. Under Armenian law, they are eligible for fast-track dual citizenship.

Other foreigners must live in the South Caucasus country for at least three years before they can become its citizens.

Fidanyan did not name the countries

whose nationals applied for Armenian citizenship after the Russian invasion of Ukraine began on February 24.

Armenia has not reported a massive influx of ethnic Armenian refugees from Ukraine. The Armenian community in Ukraine had at least 100,000 members before the war.

In the last two months, Armenia has attracted instead thousands of Russian migrants. Most of them are young professionals who are thought to have left Russia for primarily economic reasons.

## Armenia, Georgia sign 2022 Plan on Military Cooperation

On an official visit to Georgia, Armenian Defense Minister Suren Papikyan had a meeting with his Georgian counterpart Juansher Burchuladze.

A number of issues of regional security were discussed at the meeting.

Suren Papikyan and Juansher Burchuladze referred to the prospects of devel-

oping bilateral defense cooperation in the



fields of military education, exchange of experience, morals, human rights, social security and other areas.

At the end of the meeting, the 2022 Agreement on Military Cooperation between the Ministries of Defense of the Republic of Armenia and the Republic of Georgia was signed.

## Armenia to host session of UN World Tourism Organization

Armenia will host the 67<sup>th</sup> meeting of the United Nations World Tourism Organization (UNWTO) this year. The session will take place on June 1-2.

Sisian Poghosian, chair of the Tourism Committee of the Armenian Ministry of Economy, told Armenpress that this year's topic of the session will be the rural tourism, which they have chosen together with the UN.

"In addition to the UNWTO internal issues, the steps to increasing the role of sustainable tourism development will also be discussed. Every year the meeting is taking place in different countries. The fact that it is held in Yerevan this year for the first time is a great progress and a very important opportunity to present Armenia to the whole world", the Committee chair said.

Sisian Poghosian said that the session will be attended by the UNWTO Secretary-General, the UNWTO regional director, tourism officials, ministers, media representatives, etc. The representatives of Armenia's rural tourism will also have a great opportunity to communicate with the session participants. They will have a chance to exchange experience and establish new cooperation.



The UNWTO Secretary-General is expected to meet with Armenia's President, Prime Minister and Foreign Minister on the sidelines of the session.

Alessandra Priante, UNWTO Regional Director for Europe, said that the main focus of the upcoming session will be on sustainable tourism, therefore, rural tourism is highlighted, and Armenia is the country that has all prerequisites for developing the rural tourism. "Armenia, I would say, is a "hidden treasure", and has all what Europeans are interested in. The only problem Armenia has is to be more popular. For example, Italy doesn't have that problem as it is one of the biggest tourism countries, but Armenia has that problem. Armenia has an interesting position in the region and it must present itself better with its beauty",

the UNWTO Regional Director for Europe said.

Alessandra Priante said that this conference is a very good opportunity for Armenia to become more popular and implement new programs.

Alessandra Priante said the tourism figure has significantly declined due to COVID-19, but as a result there is an interesting trend among the people as they have started to better know their own countries. "The

second biggest problem during the pandemic was the safety problem, people were afraid, because tourism was that people had to communicate with each other, now everyone is urged to wear face masks and keep a social distance. We now have a big work to do in this direction in order to again inspire trust in people", Priante said.

## Yerevan buys 12-meter MAN buses

Yerevan purchases 12-meter MAN buses with government support, Yerevan Mayor Hrachya Sargsyan wrote on his Facebook page.

"According to the contract, the term of delivery of the buses is set until March-April, 2023", Sargsyan wrote.

In 2022, it is planned to have a non-cash payment system in some of the routes, and to complete the final implementation of the unified ticket system in



2023.

Drivers are moving to a stable salary. The monthly salary, depending on the size of the vehicle, is 250 or 350 thousand AMD.

This year, for the first time, drivers were provided with the opportunity to use the health insurance package.

"It is planned to announce a tender for the purchase of 15 new 12-meter trolleybuses," Sargsyan wrote.

## Justice Dept. Moves to Seize \$63 Million L.A. Mansion Belonging to Armenia's Ex-Finance Minister



The Justice Department announced Thursday that it is seeking to seize a more than 30,000-square-foot mega-mansion in the Holmby Hills neighborhood of Los Angeles, pursuant to a civil forfeiture complaint filed that alleges that the mansion was purchased with bribes paid by an Armenian businessman to the family of Gagik Khachatryan, a former high-ranking Armenian public official.

Khachatryan, 66, was appointed Armenia's Finance Minister in 2014 by former president Serzh Sarkisian, although his involvement in Armenia's customs and internal revenue department dates back to 2000 when Robert Kocharyan was president.

Khachatryan became known as the "Super Minister," because of his significant responsibilities, served as Chairman of the State Revenue Committee of the Republic of Armenia from 2008 to 2014 and as Minister of Finance of Armenia from

2014 to 2016.

In the complaint, which was filed Monday in U.S. District Court for the Central District of California, the United States alleges that businessman Sedrak Arustamyan paid Khachatryan and his family more than \$20 million in bribes in exchange for favorable tax treatment of his businesses.

The bribe payments allegedly were used to purchase the Holmby Hills property, which had been recently listed for sale for \$63,500,000, said the Justice Department.

Gagik Khachatryan and his sons are charged in Armenia with receiving bribes in violation of the criminal code of the Republic of Armenia. Criminal charges are also pending in Armenia against Arustamyan for paying bribes.

"This matter was investigated by the FBI's Eurasian Organized Crime Task Force (EOCTF) and the U.S. Marshals Service. The Republic of Armenia's Prosecutor General's Office and National Security Service provided critical assistance," said the Justice Department in its statement.

The Los Angeles Times reported on Friday that Khachatryan and his sons used the \$20 million "loan" from Arustamyan to form multiple entities "to receive, disguise and conceal illegal bribe payments" as well as their purchase of the Holmby Hills prop-

erty.

Soon after buying the home, which was previously owned by a Lions Gate Entertainment executive, the Khachatryan razed the property and hired the high-coveted architect Richard Landry to design the mansion, the L.A. Times reported.

"Plans called for an elaborate compound, including rooms for Khachatryan, his two sons and his daughter, along with servants' quarters, a wine cellar and a two-story library, according to court filings," reported the L.A. Times. "Construction began in 2015, and although the home's French-Normandy exterior was completed, along with gardens, a pool and spa, the interior is incomplete."

Khachatryan left his post in 2016 when the alleged bribery scheme came to light. He was charged with abused of power and embezzlement in 2019. His sons, who have since fled Armenia, were charged in 2020.



## Turkey denies FlyOne Armenia overflight permit

The Turkish aviation authorities have denied FlyOne Armenia airline an overflight permit for flights to European countries through its airspace.

The airline is therefore canceling all flights to Lyon and Paris until June 10.

Meanwhile, the Yerevan-Istanbul-Yerevan flights will be carried out as scheduled.

FlyOne Armenia will provide further updates on the resumption of flights. It apologizes to passengers for the inconvenience this may cause.

The company offers to change the date of the flight or get a full refund.





## Armenia Marks WW2 Victory Day

Armenia's leaders and ordinary citizens laid flowers at a World War Two memorial in Yerevan on May 9 as they marked the 77th anniversary of the Soviet Union's victory over Nazi Germany.

The anniversary has remained a public holiday, officially called Victory and Peace Day, in Armenia after the breakup of the Soviet Union.

Some 320,000 residents of Soviet Armenia, then a republic of just 1.3 million people, were drafted to the Soviet army during the bloodiest war in the history of humankind. The total number of its ethnic Armenian participants from various Soviet republics is estimated at more than 500,000. About half of them were killed in action.

In a statement issued on the occasion Pashinyan praised Armenians' "invaluable" contribution to the defeat of "one of the greatest evils: fascism."

## Armenian FM, Sen. Menendez discuss issues of regional security



Within the framework of his working visit to the US, Armenian Foreign Minister Ararat Mirzoyan met with the Chairman of the US Senate Foreign Relations Committee, Senator Bob Menendez. Senator Jim Rich, a member of the commission, also attended the meeting.

The interlocutors touched upon the agenda of the Armenian-American relations, as well as a number of issues related to the security situation in Armenia, Artsakh and the region.

The parties hailed the achievements registered during the 30 years of Armenian-American diplomatic relations. The

Armenian Foreign Minister stressed the importance of the US support for the reforms being carried out in Armenia, the strengthening of democracy, the development of economy, as well as the importance of the agreements reached during the visit.

Ararat Mirzoyan praised Bob Menendez for his contribution to the adoption of the Senate resolution on the recognition of the Armenian Genocide, which is important from the point of view of justice, ensuring the supremacy of humanitarian values, and preventing further genocides.

The Armenian Foreign Minister also presented the current humanitarian situation in Nagorno Karabakh, Armenia's position on the peaceful settlement of the Nagorno-Karabakh conflict. In this context, the inadmissibility of provoking tension by Azerbaijan was stressed.

The need to repatriate Armenian prisoners of war and civilian

hostages held in Azerbaijan was stressed.

The Foreign Minister also presented the latest developments aimed at the normalization of relations between Armenia and Turkey.

Ararat Mirzoyan presented the Order of Friendship to Bob Menendez, awarded on the occasion of the 30th anniversary of the establishment of diplomatic relations between Armenia and the United States for his significant contribution to the strengthening and development of the Armenian-American friendly relations.



## Uruguay's Senate puts appointment of ambassador to Ankara on hold after Cavusoglu's nationalist gesture to Armenians



Uruguay's Senate unanimously agreed on May 3 not to move on with its advice and consent regarding the appointment of Hugo Cayrús as the country's next ambassador to Ankara following the embarrassing incidents caused in Montevideo by Turkey's Foreign Minister Mevlüt Çavuşoğlu, *MercoPress* reports.

The decision was mooted by Broad Front (Frente Amplio – FA) opposition

Senator Liliam Kechichian, at whose request the Upper House agreed to send the dossier back to the International Affairs Committee.

Cayrús “is a career ambassador of whom we have a high regard, it is rather a reason of opportunity,” explained Kechichian, who has already admitted she would prefer

this appointment to be parallel to that of the ambassador to Armenia.

Çavuşoğlu had shown his fingers in a gesture linked with the Turkish far-right group Grey Wolves, to a group of Armenians objecting to his presence in the Uruguayan capital just days before another anniversary of the Armenian genocide perpetrated in 1915 by the Ottoman Empire, of which Ankara has admitted to descend.

The Turkish minister was in Montevideo to attend the opening of the new embassy and also to sign documents marking the beginning of negotiations for a bilateral Free Trade Agreement (FTA).

The Senate is now waiting for Foreign Minister Francisco Bustillo to report on the current state of relations with Turkey after the incident. Cayrús already appeared weeks ago before the Senate International Affairs Committee to present his curriculum vitae and a work plan.

Earlier this week, Çavuşoğlu maintained his gesture was “the necessary response” to the protesters’ “unpleasant attitudes.”

“After these unacceptable and ugly attitudes, we gave the necessary response,” said Çavuşoğlu, according to Turkish media *Hurriyet*.

The minister also said he did not consider his attitude an insult. “We said that we should look to the future,” he added.

back to the Earth the first data from its surface. The same year, in 1971, NASA’s MARINER 9 became the first Orbiter around Mars. These milestones were followed by dozens of successful missions by NASA providing us with more accurate images and information from our neighbor in the Solar System. In the summer of 2020, three space agencies around the world plan to launch pioneering missions to arrive at Mars in 2021.

## Armenia's Rosa Linn: From a small town to Eurovision in a 'Snap'!

From writing songs in her room as a child to performing Snap on one of the world's biggest stages, Rosa Linn's road to the Eurovision Song Contest has been one full of unexpected opportunities.

Hailing from the small town of Vanadzor in northern Armenia, Rosa figured that her love of music would just stay between her and her friends. She loved writing and creating melodies, and was even in the running to represent her country at Junior Eurovision, but she was concerned that her pathway to musical success was limited.

"I started making music when I was 11 or 12, in a small town. I had no resources, no connections, no money, I was just a kid with a guitar or piano who really wanted to make music. I had a lot of times when I wanted to give up, since I didn't see a future. I just went on because I couldn't not make music!" Rosa Linn said in an interview with [Eurovision's official website](#).

That's where the Nvak Foundation and Collective come in. A nonprofit organization and record label started by Armenian-Americans Alex Salibian and Tamar Kaprelian (who represented Armenia at Eurovision 2015 as a member of the group Genealogy), Nvak provides resources to up and coming artists from underrepresented communities. Rosa just happened to be one of their first discoveries:

"They just find talent and songwrit-



ers and give them everything they need to make their creations possible. I first met them in 2019 when I was performing with my band. They saw me and asked if I wanted to apply for a summer program in Yerevan. They then started a label, and asked me to join as an artist...and I said 'of course!'"

Even with the support of Nvak, Rosa knows that she has to be her own biggest advocate and cheerleader, and she urges other budding musicians in her shoes to do the same.

"Odds were against me...my only advice is that if you really feel that you've found something that is you, go with it! The universe, the world, God, energy, something will make your dream come true. If you don't do it, of course you won't succeed. Work hard, try hard, dream big, and always stay objective about things," Armenia's Eurovision entrant said.

Rosa's song *Snap* is deeply personal,

but it's a message that probably resonates with many viewers, especially after the past few years.

"I was feeling really down and depressed and anxious because I was going through a lot. These past two years we've **all** been going through a lot! And I just wrote it all out and let it go. In the end I've realized that every difficulty is easier to overcome when you love

yourself a bit more and take care of yourself, and that's my main message. Take care of yourselves and read what's really going on inside yourself. If something's wrong, you need to deal with that and work to make things better," she said.

The staging for *Snap* reflects that same journey of self-discovery and healing, but it also reflects Rosa's own journey as she grew from a preteen scribbling lyric in her room to performing in front of millions of viewers around the world.

"It's about the songwriting process, starting in my room! I can go back in time and show people how I started. It's also about going through the process and revealing stuff and then it's a way into my inner world as I get to know myself.," Rosa added.

Armenia competes in the First Semi Final of the 2022 Eurovision Song Contest on Tuesday 10 May.

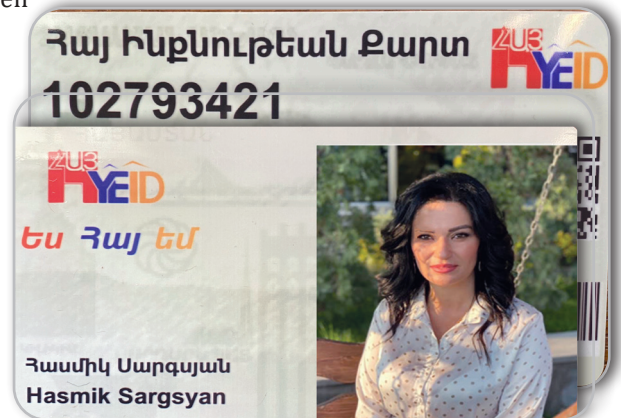
