

Armenia expects Russian peacekeepers to take concrete, visible steps to resolve the situation in Artsakh – MFA



The recent statements issued by the Ministries of Foreign Affairs and Defense of Azerbaijan once again clearly show that the aim of the policy of systematic violence and intimidation of Azerbaijan against Nagorno Karabakh (Artsakh) is the ethnic cleansing of the Armenian settlements there, the Armenian Foreign Ministry said in a statement.

Thus, it said, on March 24, the invasion of the village of Parukh in Nagorno-Karabakh was preceded by the indiscriminate firing of Armenian settlements on civilian infrastructure, as well as the harassment of the Armenian population of the village of Khramort near the village of Parukh.

“In parallel with this invasion and provocation of hostilities, in unprecedented cold weather conditions, Azerbaijan has been disrupting the operation of a vital gas pipeline for several weeks, putting the people of Nagorno Karabakh on the brink of a humanitarian catastrophe. Moreover, in order to complete its policy of ethnic cleansing and to implement the policy of genocide of the Armenians of Artsakh with new vigor, Azerbaijan demands with its statements the withdrawal of the self-defense forces of the Armenian population of Nagorno Karabakh,” the Foreign Ministry

said.

“The statements of the Azerbaijani Foreign and Defense Ministries prove that Azerbaijan’s aggression in Nagorno Karabakh in the area of responsibility of the Russian peacekeeping troops is pre-planned, which is a clear contempt for the commitments made in the November 9, 2020 tripartite statement, including the provision requiring the sides to stop on their positions,” the Armenian Foreign Ministry stated.

“The international community must take effective and targeted steps to prevent attempts to destabilize the situation in the South Caucasus. At the same time, we believe that it is necessary to properly investigate the actions of the peacekeeping contingent during the intrusion of Azerbaijani troops into the zone of responsibility of the Russian peacekeeping contingent, and formulate a clear demand for the Azerbaijani troops to return to their positions,” the statement reads.

“We also expect the Russian peacekeeping contingent in Nagorno Karabakh to take concrete, visible steps to resolve the situation, to prevent new casualties and hostilities,” the Ministry stated.

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Armenian FM briefs OSCE envoy on Azerbaijan's invasion of Parukh village, other steps aimed at ethnic cleansing

Armenian Foreign Minister Ararat Mirzoyan received on March 25 the Personal Representative of the OSCE Chairman-in-Office Andrzej Kasprzyk.

Minister Mirzoyan referred to the Azerbaijani invasion launched on March 24 in the area of responsibility of the Russian peacekeeping contingent in Artsakh near the village of Parukh, the Azerbaijani actions deliberately obstructing the



and other steps aimed at ethnic cleansing. The need for the return of Azerbaijani units to the starting positions on March 23 was stressed.

Ararat Mirzoyan presented the position of the Armenian side on the negotiations between Armenia and Azerbaijan on the peace agreement, emphasizing in that context the mediating role of the OSCE Minsk Group Co-Chairs.

Artsakh President signs decree on temporary restriction of rights and freedoms in the state of martial law

On March 26, President of the Artsakh Republic Arayik Harutyunyan signed a decree on temporary restrictions on rights and freedoms in the state of martial law declared in the territory of the Artsakh Republic.

Pursuant to the decree, during the term of martial law declared in the territory of the Artsakh Republic, under the statutory procedure:

1. the right to freedom of assembly is restricted;
2. strikes and other arrangements terminating or suspending the activities of orga-

nizations are prohibited;
3. activities of organizations, engaged in propaganda or other actions spearheaded against the defense capacity and security of the Artsakh Republic are suspended.

The responsibility for ensuring the application of temporary restrictions on the rights and freedoms defined by this decree rests on the Artsakh Republic Ministry of Inter-



nal Affairs and the National Security Service.

Armenian President receives Iran's Ambassador

President Vahagn Khachaturyan received Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the Islamic Republic of Iran to Armenia Abbas Badakhshan Zohouri.

Welcoming Ambassador Abbas Badakhshan Zohouri, President Khachaturyan congratulated him on Nowruz – the Iranian New Year and sent his best wishes to the people of Iran.



The President and the Ambassador of Iran attached importance to the continuous deepening and strengthening of the Armenian-Iranian relations based on centuries-old history and mutual respect.

During the meeting, the sides exchanged views on various spheres of Armenian-Iranian cooperation and regional developments.

Azerbaijan's provocations an attempt to disrupt the peace agenda, Armenian PM says



Prime Minister Nikol Pashinyan says Azerbaijan's provocations, including the recent cut of gas supply to Artsakh, are aimed at disrupting the peace agenda.

Speaking at a government sitting on March 24 he noted that for three days residents of Artsakh have been deprived of gas supply, and this has taken place as a result of Azerbaijan's intervention.

He reminded that on March 7 the pipeline supplying gas to Artsakh had been blown up in Azerbaijan-controlled territory, and Baku was preventing the repair works citing different reasons.

"Eventually Azerbaijan repaired the gas pipeline itself. As a result, according to our information, a valve was installed

on pipeline, and on March 21, four days after restoring the gas supply, Azerbaijan simply cut off the supply without blasting the pipeline, thus proving that it was behind the March 7 blast," the Prime Minister said.

He drew special attention to the fact that both cuts took place under unprecedented weather conditions, with temperatures dropping to record low and the snow cover reaching 1 meter.

"Under these conditions Artsakh was deliberately deprived of gas supply vital for heating the schools, kindergartens and hospitals. This is enough to understand that as a result of Azerbaijan's actions Artsakh is on the edge of a humanitarian crisis. I have no doubt that the heroic people of Artsakh will endure this trial, but we must say that with its actions Azerbaijan is also doing a favor to the people of Artsakh, because this gas-related episode is a very precise and brief description of the Artsakh issue for the international community," the Prime Minister said.

He stressed that due to this episode the international community can understand the essence of the Artsakh issue without browsing through hundreds of pages and studying historical nuances.

"This indisputably demonstrates Azerbaijan's policy towards Armenians of Artsakh, i.e. make it impossible for them to live in own homeland.," he added.

PM Pashinyan said for 1.5 years Azerbaijan has been claiming a "triumphant victory" in the 44-day war, but everything shows that Azerbaijan sees the fact that about 117 000 Armenians live in Nagorno Karabakh today, despite all sufferings, as its biggest defeat and pursues the goal of completing the policy of ethnic cleansing in Artsakh.

The Prime Minister noted that there is no alternative to opening an era of peace in the region, while "with these actions and various provocations, Azerbaijan is trying divert us from the peace agenda, delegitimize this agenda to incite new escalations and wars in the region."

Moscow "extremely concerned" over Azerbaijani violations of trilateral agreements

Russia expressed "extreme concern" over the escalation in Nagorno Karabakh.

"We are extremely concerned over the escalation in Nagorno Karabakh," the Russian foreign ministry said in a statement. "The facts of ceasefire violations and the armed invasion into the area of responsibility of the Russian peacekeeping contingent, which were noted in the March 26 information bulletin of the Russian Ministry of Defense, contradict the terms of the 2020 November 9 trilateral statement signed by the leaders of Russia, Azerbaijan and Armenia."

The Russian foreign ministry added that the Russian peacekeepers are taking measures to de-escalate the situation in Nagorno Karabakh.

Russia urged the sides to display restraint and ensure the implementation of

the trilateral agreements.

Before the foreign ministry issued the statement, the Russian Defense Ministry formally accused Azerbaijan in violating the ceasefire.

In a statement released on March 26, the Russian Ministry of Defense said that on March 24 and 25 the Azerbaijani Armed Forces violated the terms of the 2020 November 9 Statement of the leaders of Armenia, Russia and Azerbaijan, entered the area of responsibility of the Russian peacekeeping contingent in Nagorno Karabakh and installed an observation post. "4 strikes were carried out on the armed formations of Nagorno Karabakh with Bayraktar TB2 UAVs in the section of Parukh village," the Russian military added.

The Russian Ministry of Defense further said that the Russian peacekeeping



contingent's command is taking measures to resolve the situation and return the troops to their initial positions. "The Azerbaijani side was urged to pull back its troops," the Russian Ministry of Defense said.

On March 24-25 the Azerbaijani troops attacked Artsakh (Nagorno Karabakh) military positions and invaded the Parukh village.

Azeri drone strikes killed 3 Artsakh troops and wounded 15 others.

PM Pashinyan holds phone talk with Vladimir Putin

Prime Minister Nikol Pashinyan had a telephone conversation with the President of the Russian Federation Vladimir Putin, Noyan Tapan was informed from the Office of the Prime Minister.

The situation created after the invasion of Azerbaijani units into the responsibility zone of the peacekeeping contingent of the Russian Federation in Nagorno Karabakh was discussed, which



Prime Minister Pashinyan assessed as tense.

PM Pashinyan raised the need to investigate the actions of Russian peacekeepers in the given situation and stressed the need for returning the Azerbaijani armed forces to their initial positions with the efforts of the Russian peacekeepers.

The leaders of the two countries agreed to make efforts to resolve the crisis situation in Nagorno-Karabakh.

France calls for withdrawal of Azerbaijani forces from Artsakh



France deplores the incidents that have occurred in Nagorno-Karabakh, in particular the armed incidents and troop movements in the Parukh and Khramort regions,

the French Ministry of Foreign Affairs said in a statement.

“It requests that the forces which have advanced withdraw to their initial positions in accordance with the ceasefire declaration of November 9, 2020,” the Ministry said.

It also took note with concern of a new gas supply disruption to the populations of Nagorno-Karabakh and requests that the connection allowing the supply of these populations be restored.

The Minister for Europe and Foreign Affairs raised this issue during his recent meetings with his Armenian and Azerbaijani counterparts and called for the supply to be restored as soon as possible, while the weather conditions remain rigorous for the populations living there.

France is in constant contact with Armenia and Azerbaijan to promote dialogue and progress on the various topics under discussion.

Ukrainian Envoy Says Rada Tweet on Karabakh ‘Not Reflecting Kyiv’s Position’

(RFE/RL) - A post on the official Twitter account of Ukraine’s parliament regarding Nagorno-Karabakh “does not reflect the position of official Kyiv,” Ukrainian Chargé d’Affaires to Armenia Denis Autonomov said on March 25.

In its tweet on March 25 the Verkhovna Rada welcomed Azerbaijan’s latest actions in Nagorno-Karabakh in the context of the ongoing Russian aggression against Ukraine.

“Azerbaijani armed forces have gone on the offensive in Karabakh, taking advantage of the circumstance that Russia has been sending its troops to Ukraine,” it said, echoing media reports that Moscow has been redeploying some of its troops stationed in Armenia as well as peacekeepers stationed in Nagorno-Karabakh as reinforcements for fighting in Ukraine.

The tweet was posted amid reports of renewed fighting in Nagorno-Karabakh

in which at least three Armenian soldiers were killed and over a dozen wounded on Friday.

“This post does not reflect the position of official Kyiv in the context that we cannot be happy about a war. Now a war is ongoing in Ukraine as well. The issue was not discussed in the Verkhovna Rada, no decision was made. Our position on the territorial integrity of other countries is very well known. It applies to Moldova, Georgia and Azerbaijan,” Autonomov said.

Official Yerevan has taken a neutral position on the Russian-Ukrainian war, which was earlier hailed by the Ukrainian diplomat.

The Ukrainian parliament’s Twitter post that caused anger in Armenian social media was later removed. The Ukrainian diplomat found it difficult to say why such a post appeared on an official account. “It is difficult for me to say who and why did



such a thing. But now that tweet has been removed,” he said.

Talking to the news website Factor.am today, Armenian Ambassador to Ukraine Vladimir Karapetyan said that the Armenian embassy in Kyiv acted promptly on the tweet. “Due to our intervention immediately after the start of working hours here, it was deleted within 15 minutes,” he said.

Karapetyan said that the issue had been discussed with all relevant bodies of Ukraine and was considered “closed.”

US voices concern over the movement of Azerbaijani troops in Artsakh

The United States has expressed serious concern about the movement of Azerbaijani troops in Nagorno-Karabakh, and considers these and other escalation measures irresponsible and provocative, Deputy head of the press service of the State Department Jalina Porter told a briefing on March 25,

“The United States is deeply concerned about the movement of Azerbaijani troops. The movement of troops and other



escalation measures are irresponsible and

create an unnecessary provocation,” she said.

“We are closely monitoring the situation along the line of contact,” Porter said. “Armenia and Azerbaijan need to use direct channels of communication to immediately de-escalate,” she added.

On Thursday, Azerbaijani troops invaded the village of Parukh in the Askeran region in Artsakh. Casualties have been reported as a result of clashes on the line of contact.



Armenian Foreign Minister Ararat Mirzoyan had a telephone conversation with US Deputy Assistant Secretary of State for European and Eurasian Affairs Karen Donfried.

The parties touched upon regional security issues. The RA Foreign Minister presented the situation created as a result of the violation of the Nagorno Karabakh line of contact by Azerbaijan and the invasion of the Parukh village of Artsakh.

Armenian FM briefs US Deputy Assistant Secretary of State on Azerbaijani provocations

The Minister stressed that Azerbaijan is grossly violating its obligations under the trilateral statements, endangering regional stability and peace.

Ararat Mirzoyan also referred to the Azerbaijani actions of targeting the civilian population in order to create a humanitarian crisis in Nagorno Karabakh, exerting psychological pressure, and deliberately obstructing the normal operation of vital infrastructure.

Minister Mirzoyan stressed that the above-mentioned actions are one of the obvious manifestations of Azerbaijan’s policy of ethnic cleansing and Armenophobia. In

this regard, the Minister stressed the need for a targeted and clear response from the international community, including the United States.

Both sides attached importance to taking steps to de-escalate the situation.

During the telephone conversation, the Armenian Foreign Minister presented the position of the Armenian side on starting negotiations between Armenia and Azerbaijan on the peace agreement.

The interlocutors touched upon the process of dialogue between Armenia and Turkey.

The status of Artsakh and protection of its people’s rights remain key – Armenian FM

There is nothing unacceptable to Armenia in Azerbaijan’s proposals, Foreign Minister Ararat Mirzoyan said at a Q&A session at the National Assembly.

He added that those proposals did not fully address the whole agenda of potential negotiations, Armenia has supplemented these proposals and forwarded to the Minsk Group Co-Chairs.

The Minister said the proposals have been handed over to official Baku, but “there has been no response so far.”

He stressed that one of the key points is “the issue of the status of Artsakh and the

protection of rights of its population.”

“No agenda can be considered complete unless this issue is included,” he said.

Ararat Mirzoyan noted that the developments in Ukraine have sharply complicated the work of the OSCE Minsk Group co-chairmanship.

“However, judging from certain messages and impulses I have received from co-chairing countries and a number of other countries is that the international community continues to see the settlement of the Nagorno Karabakh issue within the framework of the OSCE Minsk Group,”



the Foreign Minister said.

“We are working on daily basis to organize a discussion within the framework of the Minsk Group co-chairmanship, including on the proposals of Armenia and Azerbaijan,” he concluded.

France interested in Armenia's experience of engaging women into IT industry



The recent working visit of Armenia's Minister of Labor and Social Affairs Narek Mkrtchyan to the United States was full of meetings. He participated in the 66th session of the UN Commission on the Status of Women. The agenda covered issues relating to women's engagement in different areas, raising their role, protecting their rights, etc.

Presenting details to ARMENPRESS from his visit, the Minister touched upon his meeting with the French Minister Del-

egate for Gender Equality, Diversity and Equal Opportunities Elisabeth Moreno. Mr. Mkrtchyan said France is interested in Armenia's experience of engagement of women into IT industry.

"Armenia has quite a good experience in terms of female engagement to the IT field, which was interesting for France. They have applied to us requesting support, so that developing and introducing this model will be more effective. For instance, France is interested in the activities on raising the interests among school-age girls towards information technologies. As you know, we have engineering laboratories in schools. Armath engineering laboratories are among the best ones. The TUMO project is quite a successful initiative", the minister said.

At the meeting with the French minister, Narek Mkrtchyan agreed to expand the cooperation framework. It will soon be in a

form of a memorandum. Narek Mkrtchyan also invited Elisabeth Moreno to Armenia, which was accepted, and now the dates are being clarified.

Narek Mkrtchyan also met in USA with the UN Women's Deputy Executive Director Åsa Regnér, discussing the implementation of joint programs and the possibility of opening a UN Women Office in Armenia.

For expanding the partnership framework, the Armenian Minister also met with Iran's Vice President for Women and Family Affairs Ensieh Khazali. "The importance of public perception of a family as a value was emphasized", the Armenian Minister said. "An agreement was reached to organize joint scientific events, workshops on these topics. We also agreed to sign a memorandum of cooperation with Iran aimed at deepening the collaboration in these areas", he added.

Russia will only accept rubles for gas deliveries to 'unfriendly countries': Putin

Russia will start demanding payment for its natural gas shipments to states that it deems "unfriendly" in rubles, President Vladimir Putin said on March 23 at a meeting with the government.

"I have taken a decision to switch to ruble payments for our natural gas supplies to the so-called hostile states, stop using the compromised currencies in such

transactions," Putin said according to the Kremlin.

Putin ordered the Central Bank to develop a mechanism to make ruble payments within a week.

"At the same time, I want to emphasize that Russia will definitely continue to supply natural gas in line with the volumes and prices, pricing mechanisms set forth in

the existing contracts," Putin said.

Armenian exports to Russia drop 30%



Exports from Armenia to Russia dropped 30%, Minister of Economy Vahan Kerobyan said when asked on the economic impacts of the Russia-Ukraine conflict.

He said the figure is concerning.

At the same time, Kerobyan said there is growth of exports in other directions.

“We are now working with exporters

so that they re-sign their contracts in conditions of new prices, which will result, we think, in increase of exports volumes because the deficit which appeared in the Russian market after many Western companies shut down allows us to assume that we can increase the share of our market in the Russian market,” he said.

Armenian government to return 50% of revenue tax to IT companies for new jobs

The Armenian government approved the government support procedure for commercial organizations and private entrepreneurs in the IT sector.

“With this decision we return 50% of the revenue tax for newly created jobs to improve certain conditions for IT organizations,” the State Revenue Committee Chairman Rustam Badasyan said.

“There are two goals: First of all, we have a big group of freelancers who work in the shadow, at home, they work under various contracts for foreign organizations and work in the shadow. We offer the kind of conditions for them to benefit from state



social credits upon being registered legally, and that being registered becomes more beneficial than not registered. Secondly, many countries fight to keep highly qualified IT experts and there is big competition in this sector. Particularly, various

privileges exist in both European countries and in CIS countries. For example, in Uzbekistan, Georgia there are various IT sector privileges,” he said, adding that they want Armenian IT companies to be competitive in this context.

Companies qualifying for the support program must have at least 50 new jobs as of March 1. “I mean not the work contracts but the legal contracts. And for these 50 employees the companies must not have had paid revenue tax for the preceding 6 months before March 1. Meaning, this is about completely newly opened jobs.”

Artsakh applies to Putin, asks to increase the peacekeeping contingent

During the sitting of March 25, Artsakh's Security Council made a decision to address an official letter to the President of the Russian Federation, Chairman of the Security Council Vladimir Putin, proceeding from the military-political situation in the Artsakh Republic.

The letter refers to the fact that since the day of the deployment of Russian peacekeepers in Artsakh, in general, the military staff has acted with high efficiency, fulfilling its tasks. It notes that many issues created by the Azerbaijani military-political leadership were resolved with the direct, rapid and active participation of the troops, due to which Artsakh began to overcome the consequences of the war.

However, since March 8, 2022, the Azerbaijani side has been carrying out humanitarian, psychological and military aggression with great intensity.

Describing in detail the aggressive ac-

tions of Azerbaijan launched against the population of Artsakh since the beginning of March, including the military aggression against Parukh and the surrounding areas, a number of suggestions are presented at the end of the letter.

President of the Artsakh Republic, President of the Security Council Arayik Harutyunyan said, in part:

“The Security Council of the Artsakh Republic has decided to apply to you, asking you to take measures to ensure that the Azerbaijani leadership complies with the provisions of the Statement adopted on November 9, 2020.

The people of Artsakh need security conditions to live in our historical land and to heal the wounds of war. However, as it was presented, Azerbaijan's offensive operations do not make it possible to engage in a peaceful daily life, so we believe that additional security measures are needed.

Accordingly, we consider that the current number of peacekeeping personnel and technical means provided under the Statement is insufficient for the full implementation of the peacekeeping mission in Artsakh, taking into account the growing nature of Azerbaijan's military aspirations.

In addition to suppressing the current Azerbaijani aggression and withdrawal of Azerbaijani forces to their starting positions, please review the current number of Russian peacekeepers and the number of supporting means, and increase the number of both military personnel and equipment.

It should be added that the Artsakh authorities have established constructive working relations with the peacekeeping troops, we are ready to provide the staff with the necessary living conditions. The construction works to be carried out for that purpose have already been undertaken.”

Armenia applies to ECHR and UN Court, requesting an interim measure against Azerbaijan

Armenia's Representative on International Legal Matters has submitted a request with the European Court of Human Rights for urgent interim measures under Rule 39 of its Rules of Court against Azerbaijan in connection with the recent violations committed against the people of Artsakh.

In particular, concrete evidence has been presented that since February, the Azerbaijani forces stationed near the village of Khramort in the Askeran region have been regularly threatening the peaceful population of Artsakh, demanding to leave their homes and the area.

The request for interim measure presents the cases of indiscriminate shooting from the Azerbaijani side at the civilian population and infrastructure of Artsakh,



including schools, as a result of which the main pipeline supplying natural gas to Artsakh was damaged. The entire population of Artsakh was deprived of natural gas supply. In these cramped weather conditions, the entire population of Artsakh, including hospitals and schools, has to survive without natural gas.

Such encroachments are a direct threat not only to the village of Khramort, but to

the entire population of Artsakh.

Based on these facts, combining them with the case law of the European Court, the RA representative on international legal issues stated that the actions of Azerbaijan directly endanger the fundamental rights of the people of Artsakh protected by the Convention and pose a threat of irreversible loss. The European Court has been asked to take urgent interim measures against Azerbaijan, to oblige to stop the threats, to fire, to restore the supply of natural gas.

On March 25, the Representative on International Legal Matters also appealed to the International Court of Justice, drawing attention to the above-mentioned violations committed by Azerbaijan.

Azerbaijan's criminal and impudent behavior a slap to civilized humanity – Artsakh Ombudsman



Azerbaijan's criminal and impudent behavior is a slap in the face to all civilized humanity, which remains persistently silent, Ombudsman of Artsakh Gegham Stepanyan said in a statement on social media.

"The genocidal acts committed against the Armenians of Artsakh at the beginning of the 20th century, the 70-year persecution of the Armenians after the annexation of Artsakh to Soviet Azerbaijan in 1921, the systematic discrimination and ethnic hatred, the atrocities committed by Azerbaijan since 1988 in Sumgait, Baku,

Gandzak-Kirovabad and other places to suppress the free expression of will of the Armenians of Artsakh, the war imposed in the 1990s, the 2016 April aggression, the 44-day war of 2020, which is full of war crimes, all the criminal actions taken by the military-political leadership of Azerbaijan since November 9, 2020 are an attempt to nullify the collective measures taken by the international community over decades after the Second World War to prevent such crimes.

Azerbaijan is openly, publicly giving a "master class on the destruction and deportation of a concrete ethnic group" to the world, which even fails to make condemning statements. That is why Azerbaijan is developing its arsenal of tools and means of committing crimes almost every day, that is why the Armed Forces of Azerbaijan, openly violating the provisions of the Trilateral statement of November 9, 2020, dare to occupy civilian communities, to

leave more than 120,000 people without heating and hot water, forcibly displace them. It can be listed endlessly.

Such arguments of the Azerbaijani side considering the disruption of gas supply and the humanitarian catastrophe resulting from it as a matter of its internal affairs were once made by the leadership of Nazi Germany during the Nuremberg trial to justify the atrocity crimes.

Dear representatives of the international community, the facts and evidence are more than enough to enforce the principle of "responsibility to protect" adopted to prevent genocide, crimes against humanity, and mass crimes, to recognize the Artsakh Republic and save the Armenians of Artsakh from ethnic cleansing and genocide.

Please, finally realize that there is no other option; the criminal must be punished and not negotiated with", the statement says.

Italian MPs condemn Azerbaijan's destruction of Artsakh's cultural heritage

We were obliged to support the resolution "On the destruction of cultural heritage in Nagorno Karabakh" adopted by the European Parliament on March 10. Remaining indifferent would mean to "share an unacceptable responsibility", ARMENPRESS reports this is the opinion of Italian MPs, representative of the Five Star Movement Fabio Massimo Castaldo and member of "Lega" party Susanna Ceccardi, who supported the resolution.

According to Agenzia Nova, Castaldo noted that in Nagorno Karabakh "Azerbaijani authorities are trying to forcibly uproot the cultural heritage of the indigenous Armenian people."

"Monuments, medieval monasteries, churches, tombs. There is no respect for the alive or the dead. By erasing the past, the Azerbaijani authorities want to justify their future for the region, but we can not allow that to happen. The European Parlia-



ment must be clear and ask the Azerbaijani authorities to immediately end this barbaric vandalism, to start a constructive, inclusive dialogue in the region," representative of the Five Star Movement Fabio Massimo Castaldo said.

He noted that they support the UNESCO mission, condemning Baku's actions to hinder that mission. "History cannot be rewritten to justify expansionist ambitions. It was our responsibility to support this resolution, which was passed by an over-

whelming majority and has great significance," Castaldo concluded.

Ceccardi noted that the damage done to the Armenian cultural heritage in Artsakh - churches, museums, as well as cemeteries - is aimed at erasing the centuries-old memory of an entire nation. The member of the European Parliament stated that it is inadmissible to accept a cultural genocide of this scale.

"Armenian culture has already seen the systematic erasure of some episodes of its history in recent years, as in 2005, when the Nakhichevan Jugha cemetery was destroyed with a pneumatic hammer. In the Middle Ages, thousands of khachkars (cross-stones) delicately carved on tuff were removed once and for all. As stated in our resolution, UNESCO is obliged to visit the region, inventory and preserve the heritage. Indifference is an unacceptable joint complicity," Ceccardi said.

Azerbaijan resorts to human rights violations in the absence of clear international reaction – Amb. Hovhannisyán

Azerbaijan has intensified the violations of human rights of the people of Nagorno-Karabakh, Andranik Hovhannisyán, Armenia's Permanent Representative to the Un Office in Geneva, said at the Human Rights Council debate on "Human rights situation that require Council's attention."

"For more than ten days the gas pipeline that supplies hydrocarbon energy to Nagorno-Karabakh was cut from the territories that are under control of armed forces of Azerbaijan. The latter obstructed the access to the area for conducting necessary mending activities, leaving more than 120 thousand people to freeze in the still winter conditions of the mountainous terrain," the Ambassador said.

"The Ombudsperson of Nagorno-Karabakh registered that the temperature in the hospitals was 15 degrees Celsius at best, which affected also the treatment of 51 newborns and their mothers at the maternity wards. 65% of the schools in Nagorno-Karabakh stopped operating. The attendance of the kindergartens dropped down to 22%," he added.

He noted that the disruption of gas was not an isolated incident. Besides that, Azerbaijan constantly exerts to the threat and use of force, as well as obstructs the people from obtaining their means of subsistence, if we are to name but a few of its actions.

"Everyone has the right to life, liberty and security of person. Azerbaijan should get a clear signal that at all times and circumstances the protection of these inalienable rights prescribed in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights should not be compromised," the Permanent Representative stated.

"Azerbaijan has turned the disruption of gas supply to Nagorno-Karabakh into a weapon of collective punishment of the people. For ten days residential buildings, hospitals and schools were left with-



out heating. The gas supply was restored briefly during the weekend only to be cut again on Monday. Yesterday, the civilians of Nagorno-Karabakh – children, elderly, disabled people – again were obliged to spend a night without heating in the freezing winter conditions of minus four degrees Celsius. It is a humanitarian disaster," Andranik Hovhannisyán stated.

"Azerbaijan resorts to these violations of human rights in the absence of clear and loud international reaction. We emphasize the necessity of sending a strong signal that the human rights should be respected at all times and in all circumstances. This is a collective commitment, which requires an unwavering support," he said.

"Azerbaijan installed loudspeakers in the vicinity of the Armenian villages close to the Line-of-Contact. It has been intimidating and terrorizing the rural indigenous population by threats spread through those loudspeakers, forcing the civilian population to leave their ancestral homes," the Ambassador added.

"Azerbaijan has also kept under fire those villages. Some villages have already

evacuated women, children and elderly, which came to add to another 40 000 Armenians who were displaced by the recent war," he added.

"We also highlight that Azerbaijan exploits the HRC floor to disseminate ungrounded allegations. In this context Armenia would like to remind that International Court of Justice by its order of 7 December 2021 practically rejected a number of allegations that had been put forth by Azerbaijan. The Court having considered the terms of the provisional measures requested by Azerbaijan ruled out, in particular, the false narrative that Azerbaijan has been actively promoting and pushing forward on the demining-related operations. Moreover, Armenia, as a humanitarian gesture, has handed to Azerbaijan all the maps of the minefields under its disposal," Amb. Hovhannisyán noted.

In the same manner, he said, Azerbaijan tends to ignore the plight of more than 1 000 missing persons from Armenia and Nagorno-Karabakh. The truth is that over the years Azerbaijan rejected any cooperation in this regard, he stressed.

Armenian Ambassador visits Madeira



Armenia's Ambassador Karen Nazarian visited Madeira on March 23, where he met with Dr. José Manuel Rodrigues, President of the Legislative Assembly. Following the meeting, on behalf of the president and government of Armenia, the Ambassador presented Rubina Everlein Berardo (former Madeiran deputy to the Portuguese Assembly from 2015-2019) with the state Medal of Gratitude in appreciation for her role in promoting friendly relations with

Armenia and contributing to the protection of universal values.

In his remarks the Ambassador mentioned that the principled stance of Rubina Berardo on human rights matters led to the adoption of a vote in April 2019 by the legislatures of Portugal on the Armenian Genocide perpetrated in the Ottoman Empire.

Ambassador Nazarian further stressed



that memory is an important element for the reconciliation of peoples and the protection of fundamental human rights. The ceremony was also attended by the vice-presidents and leaders of factions of the parliament of the Autonomous Region of Madeira and members of the Berardo family.

During his visit to the autonomous region, Karen Nazarian met also with Dr. Jorge Carvalho, Regional Secretary for Education, Science and Technology, D. Nuno Brás da Silva Martins, Bishop of the Catholic Church. Ambassador presented the interlocutors with the developments in and around Armenia and Artsakh (Nagorno Karabakh) and discussed the opportunities of decentralized cooperation.

Eduard Aghajanyan briefs OSCE PA on “creeping war” unleashed by Azerbaijan



Chairman of the National Assembly's Standing Committee on Foreign Relations Eduard Aghajanyan has sent a letter to the OSCE PA President Margareta Cederfelt

and the OSCE PA Special Representative for the South Caucasus Kari Henriksen.

In the letter, the MP described the actions of the last days, the “creeping war” unleashed by Azerbaijan against Artsakh, the humanitarian crisis caused by the disruption of gas supplies.

He drew the attention of international parliamentary colleagues to the fact that while on the international arena Azerbaijan is positioning itself as a proponent of peace

in the South Caucasus, it still keeps terrorizing the people of Nagorno Karabakh with the aim of evicting Armenians from Artsakh.

Eduard Aghajanyan stressed the need for a quick response to the situation by the international community, the importance of immediately restraining Azerbaijan, and reaffirmed Armenia's readiness to resume the process of peace negotiations on the

Security issues discussed during the session of Armenia-US Strategic Dialogue

The second online session of the Armenia-US Strategic Dialogue took place on March 23. Issues related to bilateral cooperation in the defense and security spheres were discussed.

Attending the meeting from the Armenian side were representatives of the Ministries of Foreign Affairs, Defense, Territorial Administration, Infrastructure,

Emergency Situations, and High-Tech Industry, the Security Council Office, the State Revenue Committee.

The United States was represented by officials from the Department of State and the Department of Defense.

At the end of the sitting, the officials from both sides reaffirmed the mutual commitment to deepen the cooperation in



the spheres of defense, security, outlined the priorities in the sphere, and the forthcoming activities.

Artsakh can never be part of Azerbaijan. Vice president of Armenian parliament receives Ambassador of France

Vice President of the National Assembly of Armenia Ishkhan Saghatelian received French Ambassador to Armenia Anne Louyot and the First Adviser of the French Embassy in Armenia Christophe Katsahian.

Welcoming the guests, Ishkhan Saghatelian highly appreciated the Armenian-French friendly relations. “France is one of the most important and friendly countries of Armenia in Europe. We have permanently seen the support of France to the Republic of Armenia, and we are concerned about developing the bilateral relations,” Vice President of the National Assembly underlined.

Ishkhan Saghatelian presented the situation created in Armenia and in Artsakh in the post-war period, noting that both Armenia and Artsakh have the most serious security problems at this moment. After the ceasefire Azerbaijan continues its threatening rhetoric, aggression and the policy of evictions of Armenians from Artsakh. In this context Ishkhan Saghatelian noted that the Azerbaijani armed forces invaded

the sovereign territory of Armenia in two directions on the previous year and continue remaining there.

Touching upon the Artsakh problem and the processes going on around it, Ishkhan Saghatelian informed that a few days ago they exploded the pipeline from the Azerbaijani side in Artsakh, putting about 100.000 Artsakh residents before the humanitarian disaster. And plus, to this there are various threats also directed to the residents to leave the villages. “We greatly highlight the response of the international community and the distinct assessment to what is happening. The problem of Artsakh should be resolved within the framework of the OSCE Minsk Group Co-Chairmanship,” the National Assembly Vice President stressed, adding that this format should be able to be kept despite the wish of Azerbaijan. “Our position is that Artsakh can never be part of Azerbaijan,” the opposition deputy underlined.

The Ambassador inquired about the relations of the opposition with the authorities, not nominating candidate for the



President of the Republic by the opposition, the issues of signing a peace treaty with Azerbaijan, the Armenian-Turkish relations, etc. In her turn, Ambassador Anne Louyot underscored the Armenian-French high level relations, emphasized the meetings with the parliamentary opposition. The Ambassador has informed that France attentively follows the actions happening on the Armenian-Azerbaijani border.

Regarding the issue of the NK conflict settlement, Anne Louyot assured that France maintains its positions within the framework of the OSCE Minsk Group Co-Chairmanship in order to be able to help both sides to establish peace and stability in the region.

Turkey still has a long path to pass to recognize fact of Genocide at state level – historian



Turkish historian Taner Akcam delivered a lecture on the Anatomy of the Genocide in the Ottoman Empire in 1878-1924, at the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens on March 23.

The lecture was organized by the Armenian Embassy in Greece and the Faculty of Political Science and Public Management of the University, the Embassy said

in a news release.

The lecture was attended by the University’s students, lecturers, representatives of the Greek parliament and the Armenian community.

Ambassador of Armenia to Greece Tigran Mkrtchyan addressed the event participants online and thanked the University of Athens for assisting to hold the lecture. He highly valued Taner Akcam’s activity in greatly contributing to the education on genocide by his valuable scientific works about genocides and crimes against humanity.

In his remarks the Ambassador touched upon the importance of resolutions authored by Armenia in the UN Human Rights Council on prevention of genocides,

and stated that many countries, including Greece, acted as co-authors of the resolution.

During his lecture Turkish historian Taner Akcam talked about the genocide committed against the Christian population in the Ottoman Empire and mentioned the factors which served a base for its implementation.

He said after the assassination of Hrant Dink, the Turkish society has started to face its historical past, however, he adds that Turkey still has a long path to pass for recognizing the fact of Genocide at a state level. He says this is also a matter of legal consequences which is also not clearly perceived in that country.




Armenian Church disapproves Tsarukyan’s plans for constructing Jesus Christ statue citing traditions

The Armenian Church said it disapproves Gagik Tsarukyan’s plans on initiating the construction of a Jesus Christ statue in Armenia.

The Mother See of Holy Etchmiatsin said in a statement that the matter was discussed, among other issues, at the March 23 Supreme Spiritual Council assembly.

While acknowledging and appreciating Tsarukyan’s distinguished services to the Church, the Mother See of Holy Etchmiatsin said the installation of a Jesus Christ statue is not acceptable for the Church because it doesn’t correspond with the “centuries-old depiction and worship



traditions” of the Armenian Church.

At the same time, the Church said the installation of a bas-relief by the principle of a “Holy Savior” cross-stone (khachkar)

would be considered as acceptable.

The Supreme Spiritual Council called upon the authors and participants of the initiative to refrain from projects contradicting the traditions of the Armenian Apostolic Church and to be guided with approaches in line with Armenian national-church culture, ecclesiastical and theological principles.

Prosperous Armenia party leader Gagik Tsarukyan announced the tender for the construction of a Jesus Christ statue earlier in January.



French President Emmanuel Macron intends to re-bury Armenian poet and resistance fighter Missak Manouchian in the Pantheon, *Europe 1* reports.

According to the report, the President of the Republic “is thinking about it very

seriously.” “This file is at the top of the pile,” Europe 1 quotes a close adviser to the President as saying.

The report further says the committee mobilized for the transfer of the ashes of Missak Manouchian to the Pantheon will be received at the Élysée very soon.

For several years now, many personalities and political leaders have been campaigning for pantheonizing Manouchian.

Missak Manouchian, an Armenian, immigrated to France in 1925, became leader of the French Resistance Movement. The Manouchian group was shot on February 21, 1944 at Mont-Valérien. That day, Missak wrote a last letter to his wife: “I am sure that the French people and all freedom fighters will be able to honor our memory with dignity.”
